Dear Parish Family -

We have begun the Holy and Penitential Season of Lent. Lent, as you may recall, means 'new Spring time', the very name signifies that we wish to renew and grow in our relationship with Jesus, just like the earth renews itself after a long winter. If we are successful, the 'flowering' will take place at Easter. The 40 days of Lent are modeled on the 40 years Israel spent in the desert wandering in search of the Promised Land, the 40 days and nights of Noah's flood and the 40 days Jesus spent in the desert in preparation for his public ministry.

During Jesus' 40 days in the desert, he experienced depravation, temptation and tribulation. On the Tuesday's of Lent at 3pm live in the Church, Live Stream and later archived, I will offer a reflection on the suffering and tribulation in the Christian Life.

Tuesday's at 2pm and Thursday's at 7pm Fr. Jim will offering Bible Study Virtually using Google Meet.

Friday's of Lent at 3pm there will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Divine Mercy Chaplet, Stations of the Cross and Benediction. You are welcome to come live or participate via Live Stream and it will be archived for later in the day as well.

While media reports continue to speak about the rather slow roll out of the Covid-19 vaccine, the issue seems to be bureaucratic. This is what happens when politicians are in charge of medical emergencies and not healthcare workers and doctors! Too much paperwork, overly strict regulations and poor distribution are just some of the issues. Media report there is plenty of vaccine, the places where it is being administered are organized, plenty of people available to give the vaccine and plenty who want the vaccine. The government needs to get out of its own way for the good of its citizens!

I had my second Moderna shot last week. I had mild soreness at the vaccinated site and 22 hours later low grade fever, mild headache, body aches and chills. Within 10 hours I felt great again. I want to commend the Ocean County Health Department on their roll out. While it is true they have a limited supply of vaccines (which is not their fault), they are highly organized. Both appointments were 'smooth sailing'. The Ocean County Health Department has done an excellent job. Someone should put them in charge for the whole country. If they were in charge, we would all be vaccinated by now!!!

May your Lent be one of growth spiritually and may the Good Lord help you reach Calvary to experience the Resurrection!

In person Mass attendance requires:

- ✓ **Mask must cover both the nose and the mouth**
- ✓ 6 feet of social distancing
- ✓ Sit only in pews marked with green tape
- ✓ Red tape areas off limits. Remember green equals 'go' and red equals 'stop'!
- ✓ Bathrooms are for *emergency use only*, please go before leaving your home.
- ✓ Church opens 15 minutes before Mass.
- ✓ Communion is distributed after Mass ends and you must depart immediately.
- ✓ If you watch via Live Stream, you can come to Church for Communion.
- ✓ No gathering in any size group anywhere on our property.
- ✓ It is requested you take Communion in the hand but can be taken on the tongue.

The State currently permits 25% of capacity which is 286 people per Mass in our building. To assist you in assessing the risk the following numbers are the averages during Covid-19 Pandemic:

- Sat. 5pm – 130 people
- Sun. 7am – 70 people
- Sun 8:30am – 110 people
- Sun 10:30am – 190 people
- Total for all Masses = 500

❖ These numbers are averages over a 8 month period and fluctuate +/- 20 people per Mass

- Weekday Mass is 9am M- F attendance average about 40 people +/-.
- Confession by appointment only, masks, 6 feet and outside
- Baptisms, Weddings, Funerals and other Celebrations limited to 50 people this number includes family, clergy, outside attendants, anyone breathing and all the restrictions found above for weekend Masses.
