Dear Parish Family-

On Sunday we will begin the second week of Lent. We have several offerings for Lent even during the Pandemic. Tuesday's at 3pm 'Lacrimarum Vale'-'The Valley of Tears' offers reflections on suffering and Tribulation live and via Live Stream. On the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays of the month we offer; 7pm Bible Study, Thursday 2pm Bible Study and Friday 3pm Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Divine Mercy Chaplet, Stations of the Cross, ending with Benediction. All of these are available via Live Stream or electronic means. Valley of Tears and Friday offerings are live or live streamed and available archived.

On Monday we were informed that the Governor now allows up to 50% occupancy for Churches HOWEVER we are still required to follow all the other Covid-19 restrictions of distancing etc. So while this sounds great, it means nothing. Theoretically we can now seat 572 people (50% of our capacity) however we must follow the other Covid-19 restrictions so that means we can accommodate only 268 people once taking into account the other restrictions still in place. So nothing has changed! We will increase the number for funerals and weddings from 40 to 80 persons.

For the Stations of the Cross we photographed all of our own stations and formatted them into a Powerpoint. Under the current restrictions we are not permitted to process from station to station unless they are online only. We are able to have Stations Live by using this format which also works nicely for those who participate via Live Stream. All of us can "move" from Station to Station electronically. We have to be creative in these challenging times!

Thanks to all those who not only send in their offerings but those who send notes along with the offerings. It is nice to hear from you even if we cannot be physically present to one another. Again, finding creative ways to keep in touch!

I know it is a ways off at this point but the Ceremonies of Holy Week will be different this year due to the pandemic, not drastically different but the Holy See has adapted them due to Coronavirus. More on that as the time approaches. Next Month on March 19 is the Solemnity of St. Joseph Husband of Mary and while it will be quieter due to the Virus, it will also be special because it is the Year of St. Joseph.

This Saturday Feb. 27 is the feast of St. Gregory of Narek. This is the first year his feast is included, by order of Pope Francis, into the General Calendar of the Universal Church. He is venerated as a Saint in the Oriental Orthodox Armenian Apostolic Church and the Catholic Armenian Church. Pope Francis also declared him a Doctor of the Church (1 0f 36). St. Gregory of Narek was an Armenian priest in the 10th Century. The Armenian Church, while small, has been influenced by the Latin, Syriac Churches. Armenia is a small country next to Turkey. St. Gregory created his own alphabet and many words as well. He wrote in a poetic style. Pope Francis called him, "An extraordinary interpreter of the human soul". He is called the 'Doctor of Mercy' because Mercy is at the heart of most of his works. His greatest work is 'The Book of Lamentations', here is a sample called the Prayer of For-giveness, it is a good prayer for Lent!

> <u>The Prayer of Forgiveness</u> "Now what prayers in this book may be pleasing to you, What smoke of incense acceptable to you shall I offer, O Christ, praised heavenly King, If I do not pray to you to bless those who are cursed by me To release those whom I have bound, To free those I have condemned, Benefit those I have condemned, Crown those I have offended, Crown those I have offended, Console those I have made sad, Tend to those I have bruised, Care for those I have betrayed, And heal the souls of those I have wounded in body?"

- The Obligation to attend Mass is suspended <u>Until Further Notice</u>. You are not obligated to attend Mass at this time due to Pandemic. Bishop O'Connell encourages Catholics to attend an in-person Mass or participate in Mass via Live Stream until the dispensation ceases in order to "Keep Holy, the Lord's Day". Please note each week 2 Masses are archived for viewing later in the day.
- Live Streaming of all Masses is continuing. ***Those in high risk categories and those with preexisting conditions are asked to stay home and participate through Live Stream.***

In person Mass attendance requires:

- Mask must cover both the <u>nose and the mouth</u>
- ✓ 6 feet of social distancing
- ✓ Sit only in pews marked with green tape
- ✓ Red tape areas off limits. Remember green equals 'go' and red equals 'stop'!
- ✓ Bathrooms are for *emergency use only*, please go before leaving your home.
- ✓ Church opens 15 minutes before Mass.
- ✓ Communion is distributed <u>after</u> Mass ends and you must depart immediately.
- ✓ If you watch via Live Stream, you can come to Church for Communion.
- ✓ No gathering in any size group anywhere on our property.
- \checkmark It is requested you take Communion in the hand but can be taken on the tongue.

The State currently permits 25% of capacity which is 286 people per Mass in our building. To assist you in assessing the risk the following numbers are the averages during Covid-19 Pandemic:

- Sat. 5pm 130 people
- Sun. 7am 70 people
- Sun 8:30am 110 people
- Sun 10:30am 190 people
- Total for all Masses = 500
 - These numbers are averages over a 8 month period and fluctuate +/- 20 people per Mass
- Weekday Mass is 9am M- F attendance average about 40 people +/-.
- Confession by appointment only, masks, 6 feet and outside
- Baptisms, Weddings, Funerals and other Celebrations limited to 50 people this number includes family, clergy, outside attendants, anyone breathing and all the restrictions found above for weekend Masses.

Lenten Fast & Abstinence Guidelines: Abstinence from meat on Fridays of Lent (for those 14 and older) is required by Church law. Good Friday is a day of fasting: those between the ages of 18 and 59 should eat less, meaning, take no solid food between meals and only one full meal that day. Serious health conditions excuse a person from these precepts.

Prayer, Fasting, Almsgiving: Lent is above all a time of prayer. To enhance the practice of prayer, St. Aloysius is offering the following opportunities to grow your relationship with Jesus. The Church also invites her members to follow the custom of fasting & to accompany that fasting with an increase of almsgiving for the needs of the poor.
