Dear Parish family-

As we enter the fourth and final week of Advent with Christmas around the corner and the Calendar Year drawing to a close in a really challenging year, I ask for your consideration of a generous gift to your parish this Christmas. Many folks have to make an end of the year distribution from their retirement plans or make a charitable contribution to offset taxes or are in the habit of making end of the year charitable contributions. I hope you will consider your parish when making these decisions. We have three mortgages with a combined debt of nearly 5 million dollars and we are also in need of a new roof on the Church. As many of you have noted who watch live stream masses, when it rains we have to put out dozens of buckets and towels to collect the rain water falling on the Altar, Ambo, Presider's Chair and all around the Sanctuary.

When making an inquiry about the Adopt-A-Family program this week, the St. Vincent de Paul Society made me aware of a dire situation a family has fallen into regarding their mortgage. SVdP are seeking donations to assist in staving off foreclosure for a family. It is a pretty dire situation. If you were not able to take part in the virtual giving tree, virtual Adopt-A-Family or such programs and would like to help a needy family, please send a check made out to St. Vincent de Paul Society and mark it 'Christmas House Help'. You can mail it to the parish, drop it in the collection basket or drop it off at the parish office.

If you're wondering why all the Christmas decorations are squeezed between the Ambo and the Priest Chair it is because that is the area covered by our Camera for those participating via Live Stream. We had to be a little more creative this year so everyone can enjoy the festive time of the year. The stable was too big so we went without it this one year, it sees it was a 2020 trend since the Vatican did not have one either!

If you would like to read a little about the Sisters who make our hosts, there was a nice story about them on the Religion News Service. <https://religionnews.com/2020/12/15/in-a-rare-move-catholic-nuns-set-out-to-build-a-new-monastery/> These are Cistercian Benedictine Nuns supporting themselves by making hosts. We buy our hosts from them. The pandemic has not necessitated buying any hosts. We normally consecrate about 10,000 Communions a month however for the first four months it was just me and Fr. Jim and since then we are only consecrating 1000 a month, pre-pandemic we were one of their larger customers. In fact when we decided to switch from commercially made hosts to the Nuns they told us they were not even sure they could do it because we needed so many! But it all worked out and they eventually bought new equipment to accommodate a growing need for handmade hosts. While we have not been buying hosts we realize the pandemic hurts everyone especially Charities and Churches so we have been making our monthly payment to them as a gift to help them out during this terrible scourge. We all have to assist and be aware of the needs of our fellow religious who are also feeling the financial impact of the pandemic. They are a great group of nuns and every month they send a thank you to us for continuing to support their monastic way of life.

Remember and spread the word that in order to comply with NJ State Pandemic Occupancy Laws and Health Regulations, **tickets are required for all in person Christmas Masses**. They are free and a link is on our webpage. If I do not see you, have a Merry Christmas and a Blessed New Year! Remember what St. Padre Pio tell us, "Pray, Hope and Don't Worry; worry is useless, God is merciful and will hear your prayers".



There are only **270** tickets available for each Mass. You will be required to show your ticket in order to enter the Church. - The Obligation to attend Mass is suspended Until Further Notice. You are not obligated to attend Mass at this time due to Pandemic. **Bishop O'Connell encourages Catholics to attend an in-person Mass or participate in Mass via Live Stream until the dispensation ceases in order to "Keep Holy, the Lord's Day". Please note each week 2 Masses are archived for viewing later in the day.**
- Live Streaming of all Masses is continuing. ***Those in high risk categories and those with pre-existing conditions are asked to stay home and participate through Live Stream.***

In person Mass attendance requires:

- ✓ **Mask must cover both the nose and the mouth**
- ✓ 6 feet of social distancing
- ✓ Sit only in pews marked with green tape
- ✓ Red tape areas off limits. Remember green equals 'go' and red equals 'stop'!
- ✓ Bathrooms are for *emergency use only*, please go before leaving your home.
- ✓ Church opens 15 minutes before Mass.
- ✓ Communion is distributed after Mass ends and you must depart immediately.
- ✓ If you watch via Live Stream, you can come to Church for Communion.
- ✓ No gathering in any size group anywhere on our property.
- ✓ It is requested you take Communion in the hand but can be taken on the tongue.

The State currently permits 25% of capacity which is 286 people per Mass in our building. The highest # of people at Mass has been at 10:30am and we have reached 23% of capacity. 


