On August 1 the Office of Catholic Schools received a new Superintendent. JoAnn Tier who faithfully and enthusiastically served as Superintendent retired in May, however agreed to stay on due to the pandemic until the new Superintendent was able to move with his family to the Diocese. The new Superintendent is Dr. Vincent de Paul Schmidt. Dr. Schmidt has hit the ground running but due to Covid-19 he began introducing himself virtually in group sessions online to our Catholic School System Administrations in the Diocese. Having introduced himself in a group format he has now begun the process of meeting individually by phone or video conference individually. I met with Dr. Schmidt by phone this week and he made a live visit to our Academy for a Tour and to meet the Principal (they had already met virtually). Dr. Schmidt will also have a live visit with our Academy School Board and he hopes to come to meet the children sometime during the School year. We welcome Dr. Schmidt who is as equally enthusiastic and energetic as Mrs. Tier. He will certainly be a blessing to our Catholic School System, especially in this time of pandemic.

Effective August 1 the Obligation to attend Mass is suspended Until <u>Further Notice</u>. You are not obligated to attend Mass at this time due to the Pandemic. Bishop O'Connell encourages Catholics to attend an in-person Mass or participate via Live Stream until the dispensation ceases in order to "Keep

Holy, the Lord's Day". Please note each week 2 Masses are archived for viewing later in the day.

Live Streaming of all Masses is continuing. ****Those in high risk categories and those with preexisting conditions are asked to stay home and participate through Live Stream****.

In person Mass attendance requires:

- ⇒ Masks must cover both the nose and the mouth
- \Rightarrow 6 feet of social distancing
- ⇒ Sit only in pews marked with green tape
- ⇒ Red tape areas off limits. Remember green equals 'go' and red equals 'stop'!
- ⇒ Bathrooms are for *emergency use only*, please go before you arrive.
- ⇒ Church opens 15 minutes before Mass.
- ⇒ Communion is distributed <u>after</u> Mass ends and you must depart immediately.
- ⇒ If you watch via Live Stream, you can come to Church for Communion.
- ⇒ No gathering in any size group anywhere on our property.
- \Rightarrow Communion can be taken on the tongue or the hand, the risk is identical.
