Dear Parish Family-

On the four Tuesdays of October (6, 13, 20, 27) at 3pm I will be offering "An Encounter with Christian Mysticism" live in the Church. On the 6<sup>th</sup> of October there will be an overview of Mysticism in general and Christian Mysticism in particular. The remaining three Tuesdays will be overviews of the various mystics. Mysticism is part of the rich treasury of Catholic Spirituality through the ages and one that is often overlooked or little understood. Please join me live, remember to wear a mask, or join me via Live Stream, the sessions will also be archived on our You Tube Channel. In last week's bulletin there was a typographical error, it stated St. John of the Cross was a Doctor of the Church, it should have read St. John of Avila is a Doctor of the Church, these two saints are both mystics but only St. John of Avila is a Doctor of the Church. A small aside, I was present when Pope Benedict XVI declared St. John of Avila a Saint and Doctor of the Church it was at the same ceremony in St. Peter's Square in Rome that St. Hildegard of Bingen, mystic, was also declared a Saint and Doctor of the Church. I will offer reflections on both of these mystic saints who are Doctors of the Church.

Our sign board on Bennetts Mills Rd. had the Hebrew greeting 'Shanah Tovah Umetuka' for Rosh Hashanah the Jewish New Year. It means 'A good and sweet New Year' and for Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement, it read 'Gamar Chatimah Tovah' meaning 'A good final sealing in the Book of Life'. The first is a traditional New Year greeting and the second for Yom Kippur refers to the Book of Life where God inscribes the names of those chosen by Him for Heaven. Christians also share this belief, found in the Book of Revelation 20:12, "*I saw the dead, the great and the lowly, standing before the throne, and scrolls were opened. Then another scroll was opened, the book of life. The dead were judged according to their deeds, by what was written in the scrolls. The sea gave up its dead; then Death and Hades gave up their dead. All the dead were judged according to their deeds. Then Death and Hades were thrown into the pool of fire. (This pool of fire is the second death.) Anyone whose name was not found written in the book of life was thrown into the pool of fire.*" St. Paul also makes reference to the Book of Life in his letter to the Philippians.

Thank you to those who inform us when things are a little out of sync on the Live Stream. YouTube recently made some upgrades to their system and changed some settings which caused us some issues. Sometimes our internet signal can be unstable but there is nothing we can do about that. We did an overview of our equipment and found some of our switches were slow, they were once fast but standards have changed over 10 years so we are in the process of upgrading our switches to be compatible with faster speeds of traffic on our internal system and this will add stability to our systems. We discovered these issues because folks watching let us know if there are issues, sometimes the issue is also on your end! LOL. We do appreciate the feedback so we can be sure we reach you! Covid-19 is going to be with us for a long time and now there is concern about rising infection rates as autumn sets in and flu season starts (another Corona virus!). Stay safe, wear your mask, keep six feet of social distance and wash your hands!

Finally, thank you to all those able to continue being good stewards of our parish financially. Covid-19 has not only impacted health, education, work, social life, business but hit charities particularly hard, including Churches. Your continued support is critical and I am most grateful for your care, concern and partnership in the Gospel!

- ✓ Bathrooms are for *emergency use only*, please go before you arrive.
- ✓ Church opens 15 minutes before Mass.
- ✓ Communion is distributed after Mass ends and you must depart immediately.
- ✓ If you watch via Live Stream, you can come to Church for Communion.
- ✓ No gathering in any size group anywhere on our property.
- ✓ Communion can be taken on the tongue or the hand, the risk is identical.

### What does it mean to form my conscience?

Catholics have a long tradition of engagement in the public square. Sometimes that engagement requires making difficult moral decisions that impact our own lives and those of others. Our conscience can help guide the decisions we make. The Second Vatican Council guides us: "Always summoning [one] to love good and avoid evil, the voice of conscience can when necessary speak to [one's] heart more specifically: do this, shun that" (*Gaudium et Spes* 16). However, our conscience doesn't just come to us when we are born. We must work throughout our lives to form it through prayer, learning, and conversation.

#### How do I form my conscience?

It takes time to form our consciences so that we can make well-reasoned judgments about particular, real-life situations. The Church teaches that it is important to work continually on conscience formation so we can be prepared to make decisions whenever the opportunity arises. Some specific ideas to form your conscience are:

- 1) Begin by **being open to the truth** and what is right.
- 2) **Study Sacred Scripture** and the **teaching** of the Church.
- 3) **Examine the facts and background information** about various choices and be discerning in where we gather information.
- 4) **Prayerfully reflect** to discern the will of God (*Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*, no. 18).

Additionally, it is important to consider how

our community of faith can help us form good consciences through some of these steps:

- 1) Seek the **prudent advice** and **good example** of trusted leaders and others to support and enlighten our conscience.
- 2) Learn about the **authoritative teaching** of the Church.
- 3) Pray for the **gifts of the Holy Spirit** to help us develop our conscience.
- 4) Regularly partake in an **examination of conscience** to hear God's voice in your life.<sup>1</sup>

Doing the work of forming our consciences can seem daunting. Fortunately, we have many church teachings that can help us in this important task. *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship* is an important resource for U.S. Catholics and helps us prayerfully reflect on how we can apply Church teaching in our civic life. "Conscience is not something that allows us to justify doing whatever we want, nor is it a mere "feeling" about what we should or should not do. Rather, **conscience is the voice of God resounding in the human heart**, revealing the truth to us and calling us to do what is good while shunning what is evil."<sup>2</sup>

Here are some questions for further reflection:

1. When has my conscience guided me to "do good and avoid evil"?
2. What are some key resources I can use to form my conscience?
3. Forming conscience is a "lifelong task." What do I do to *regularly* form my conscience? What more should I do?
