Bishop David O'Connell, C.M. has received numerous requests for him to issue a statement regarding the upcoming elections. These are helpful and fruitful resources to help Catholics form their conscience in making a decision regarding an election.

On Wednesday, August 2, myself, Fr. P.J., Fr. Jim and Fr. Chang met with the faculty and staff of Mother Seton Academy from 10-noon and then celebrated Mass together to kick off the new academic year. There was much excitement, laughter, enthusiasm and energy among our teachers and staff. Everyone was pretty excited for the new year and we are well prepared. The Academy has been a veritable bee hive of activity for the last two weeks. A new gym floor had the finishing touches applied. New airconditioning was installed in the gym as well. Furniture and equipment was transferred from St. Aloysius to MSA this past week, needed for the new social distancing. Classrooms were sanitized and deep cleaned by our new cleaning company. Landscaping, bush and tree trimming and mulch were all completed by the new landscaping company. A day porter began work the first week of August and we welcomed a new administrative assistant in the School Office, Mrs. Stephanie Guida. Our new and improved website went live on Friday. Please feel free to check it out at www.msaedu.org. These are but a few of the improvements made to our Academy. The partnership, originally envisioned when the merger officially happened a year ago, has come to fruition with a new administrative team that are working together and in a collaborative manner with the Academy School Board. Great things are happening! Registration is open.

This past Monday we commemorated Labor Day, honoring the American Worker, the back bone of our great

nation. The Catholic Church has a rich history of social teaching, much of it touching on the dignity of work. All of the Popes from Leo XIII to Francis have written on the dignity of work and importance of Labor.

Finally, this past week I took part in a terrific webinar hosted by Georgetown University on "Pope Francis on the Reform of the Church" featuring some of the Popes closest collaborators. They really brought to light that Pope Francis is not so much looking for Reform as Conversion of Heart. Georgetown has now released the conference on their website for anyone to view. I highly recommend this conference. It will be a worthwhile 90 minutes of your time. Effective August 1 the Obligation to attend Mass is suspended <u>Until Further Notice</u>. You are not obligated to attend Mass at this time due to Pandemic. Bishop O'Connell encourages Catholics to attend an in-person Mass or participate in Mass via Live Stream until the dispensation ceases in order to "Keep Holy, the Lord's Day". Please note each week 2 Masses are archived for viewing later in the day.

Live Streaming of all Masses is continuing. \*\*\*Those in high risk categories and those with pre-existing conditions are asked to stay home and participate through Live Stream.\*\*\*

In person Mass attendance requires:

- ✓ Mask must cover both the <u>nose and the mouth</u>
- ✓ 6 feet of social distancing
- ✓ Sit only in pews marked with green tape
- ✓ Red tape areas off limits. Remember green equals 'go' and red equals 'stop'!
- ✓ Bathrooms are for *emergency use only*, please go before you arrive.
- ✓ Church opens 15 minutes before Mass.
- ✓ Communion is distributed after Mass ends and you must depart immediately.
- ✓ If you watch via Live Stream, you can come to Church for Communion.
- ✓ <u>No gathering in any size group anywhere on our property.</u>
- $\checkmark$  Communion can be taken on the tongue or the hand, the risk is identical.

# What does it mean to form my conscience?

Catholics have a long tradition of engagement in the public square. Sometimes that engagement requires making difficult moral decisions that impact our own lives and those of others. Our conscience can help guide the decisions we make. The Second Vatican Council guides us: "Always summoning [one] to love good and avoid evil, the voice of conscience can when necessary speak to [one's] heart more specifically: do this, shun that" (*Gaudium et Spes* 16). However, our conscience doesn't just come to us when we are born. We must work throughout our lives to form it through prayer, learning, and conversation.

# How do I form my conscience?

It takes time to form our consciences so that we can make well-reasoned judgments about particular, real-life situations. The Church teaches that it is important to work continually on conscience formation so we can be prepared to make decisions whenever the opportunity arises. Some specific ideas to form your conscience are:

- 1) Begin by **being open to the truth** and what is right.
- 2) Study Sacred Scripture and the teaching of the Church.
- 3) **Examine the facts** and **background information** about various choices and be discerning in where we gather information.
- 4) **Prayerfully reflect** to discern the will of God (*Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*, no. 18).

Additionally, it is important to consider how

our community of faith can help us form good consciences through some of these steps:

- 1) Seek the **prudent advice** and **good example** of trusted leaders and others to support and enlighten our conscience.
- 2) Learn about the **authoritative teaching** of the Church.
- Pray for the gifts of the Holy Spirit to help us develop our conscience.
- Regularly partake in an examination of conscience to hear God's voice in your life.<sup>1</sup>

Doing the work of forming our consciences can seem daunting. Fortunately, we have many church teachings that can help us in this important task. *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship* is an important resource for U.S. Catholics and helps us prayerfully reflect on how we can apply Church teaching in our civic life. "Conscience is not something that allows us to justify doing whatever we want, nor is it a mere "feeling" about what we should or should not do. Rather, **conscience is the voice of God resounding in the human heart**, revealing the truth to us and calling us to do what is good while shunning what is evil."<sup>2</sup>

Here are some questions for further reflection:

- 1. When has my conscience guided me to "do good and avoid evil"?
- 2. What are some key resources I can use to form my conscience?
- Forming conscience is a "lifelong task." What do I do to *regularly* form my conscience? What more should I do?
