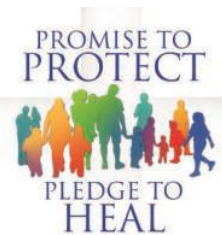

Dear Parish Family-



Monday, January 18th, the nation will pause to reflect on the monumental legacy of a great American, Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. The life of Rev. King shines brightly on how one person can achieve significant change even when their life is brief. His life was cut short by hatred and ignorance but the ideals he preached continue to guide the nation. Each year we pause, recall and reflect on his legacy (which is a living legacy not a note in the history of our country), his legacy yet lives on, survives him and encourages us still. Rev. King embodied the best of the Old and New Testaments and challenged Americans to live up to her great founding ideals and to even achieve greater goals together united as one nation, putting aside differences and disagreements and looking for the best in one another. He reminds us we are better when we embrace one another as brothers and sisters, when we strive together to better each person's station in life, when we lift one another up and, when we challenge one another, as President Lincoln said, "by the better angels of our nature".

So many of those courageous men and women who cooperated with Rev. King were clergy of all stripes and denominations, the history of the Civil Rights Movement is writ large with fellow clergymen who heard Rev. King's call to equality and joined him in struggling to bring it to fruition, who still strive to bring it to fruition.

As we come to the threshold of our national Federal holiday I leave you with some inspiring words of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. for your own reflection:

-“Whatever your life's work is, do it well. A man should do his job so well that the living, the dead, and the unborn could do it no better.”

-“We must develop and maintain the capacity to forgive. He who is devoid of the power to forgive is devoid of the power to love. There is some good in the worst of us and some evil in the best of us. When we discover this, we are less prone to hate our enemies.”

-“Whatever affects one directly, affects all indirectly. I can never be what I ought to be until you are what you ought to be. This is the interrelated structure of reality.”

-“Any religion that professes to be concerned about the souls of men and is not concerned about the slums that damn them, the economic conditions that strangle them and the social conditions that cripple them is a spiritually moribund religion awaiting burial.”

-Sermon on the Gospel of the Good Samaritan; “The first question which the priest and the Levite asked was: ‘If I stop to help this man, what will happen to me?’ But... the Good Samaritan reversed the question: ‘If I do not stop to help this man, what will happen to him?’”

And my personal favorite quote; *“In the End, we will remember not the words of our enemies, but the silence of our friends”.*

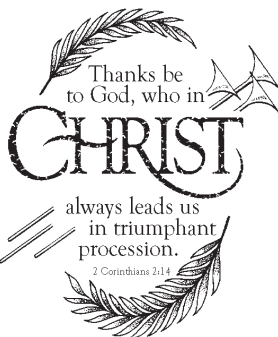
