Dear Parish Family,

I invite you to join me in welcoming the representative from the Congregation of the Mission (C.M.), also known as the Vincentians, to our parish this weekend for the annual Missionary Cooperative Plan (MCP).



This summer's appeal seeks support for the Vincentian Missions in Madagascar, an island located off the coast of Africa in the Indian Ocean. Madagascar is the fourth-largest island in the world, and the Congregation of the Mission has served there for 400 years, beginning when St. Vincent de Paul sent missionaries from Paris.

Today, the missionaries remain as dedicated as those first sent by St. Vincent 400 years ago. Although Madagascar faces significant poverty, its people possess a remarkable wealth of humor, community, and faith. Last week, I shared some information about the Vincentian missionary priest and Nobel Prize nominee, Fr. Pedro Opeka. His work among the poorest communities not only earned him a Nobel nomination but also drew the attention of Pope Francis, who visited Madagascar in 2019. Fr. Pedro visited Rome on May 28, 2023, and recounted his audience with Pope Francis: "When the door opened, he said to me: 'Pedro, how are you? The bishops of Madagascar told me about you. Have you thought about who will replace you?' This question reflects Pope Francis' perspective on life and mission: death does not deter him. 'We live to carry out a mission, and we must think about who will succeed us in the fight against injustice.'"

Today's Missionary Cooperative Plan appeal directly responds to Pope Francis' question, "Who will succeed us in the fight against injustice?" This appeal aims to sustain and expand educational opportunities for both clergy and laity, enabling them to carry out the mission of the Gospel and to build a just and lasting society for the common good.

Pope Leo has frequently expressed his pastoral concern for Madagascar. In June 2025, he addressed the Bishops of Madagascar: *"I give thanks for the missionary vitality of your particular Churches, heirs to the witness of the saints who, to bring the Gospel to that distant land, feared neither refusal nor persecution. I would like to remember Henri de Solages, the first missionary who did not let himself be discouraged by failure and imprisonment, or the martyr saint Jacques Berthieu, whose blood was the seed of Christianity in Madagascar. May your example continue to strengthen you in the giving of yourselves to Christ and to his Church, amid the successes and pastoral trials you go through in order to reach the people of God in the various realities of your dioceses! I urge you not to take your eyes off the poor: they are at the centre of the Gospel and are the privileged recipients of the proclamation of the Good News. May you recognize in them the face of Christ, and may your pastoral action always be inspired by a concrete concern for the little ones. May your ministry in this Jubilee, beyond its trials, help them to ignite the ever-new horizons of the hope offered by Christ."*

Echoing the words of Pope Leo, I encourage you not to take your eyes off the poor, who are at the heart of the Gospel. Please consider making a generous donation to the Vincentian MCP appeal. Through your prayerful support and sacrifices, you participate in the Church's missionary work, even from afar. While some, like the Vincentians, are called to direct missionary service, others, like ourselves, are called to embody the missionary spirit by making their work more manageable. As the Appalachian saying goes, "We all sup sorrow with support," meaning that hard work becomes easier with help. Our prayers and sacrifices enable missionaries to uplift the poor in places we cannot reach. I urge you to be generous.

Thank you in advance for your generosity. I know that Bishop David M. O'Connell, our Bishop and a Vincentian priest himself, also extends his gratitude.

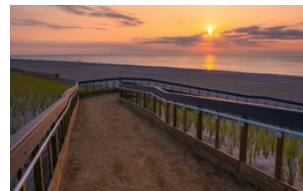

Summer invites us to slow down and rediscover the simple blessings God places in our lives.

With school on break and the pace of daily responsibilities easing, we find more time for the people who matter most. Picnics and barbecues, trips to the shore or the mountains, long evenings of sunlight and star filled skies, games in the backyard, parish carnivals, outdoor concerts, leisurely walks, renewed exercise, gardening, and the taste of fresh strawberries, Jersey tomatoes and corn on the cob – all of these moments and things remind us in summertime how richly God blesses us through creation and through one another.

This season also offers a quieter space for the soul. Summer gives us the chance to pray with fewer distractions, to stop into our parish church during the week, to celebrate God's presence more intentionally and to nourish our spirits with good reading – perhaps something that deepens our faith. The construction of a new seminary in Madagascar responds to the urgent need of the Church to form future priests in a country marked by a great poverty, but rich in vocations. It is an investment in people who will serve the poor, carry the Gospel where hope is lacking, and build the local Church from within. The new seminary is meant to be a home for vocations and a sign of faith, solidarity, and hope for Madagascar and for the entire Church.

Every year, hundreds of young men in Madagascar and other African countries feel called to dedicate their lives to God and the service of the poor. The desire is great, the number of vocations is many, yet our seminaries reach painful limits of capacity. There is a lack of classrooms, housing, and even basic conditions for proper formation,

For this reason, we humbly turn to you with a plea for help: so that we do not have to say, “there is no room,” to those whom God is calling, but can open the doors to them and provide the Church with shepherds for the future.

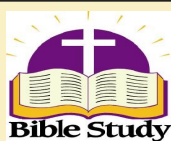


Prayer to St Michael The Archangel

Weekly Bible study, led by Fr. RJ, is on summer break. The group will resume Tuesday, September 8th. Enjoy your summer! Read your Bible!

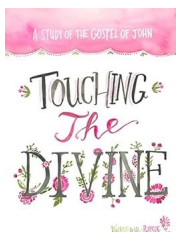

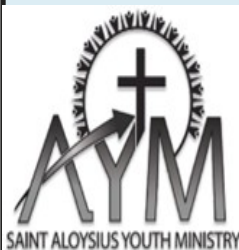

MARRIAGE CONVALIDATION - The Convalidation of a Marriage is a special wedding ceremony by which one's marriage is recognized and blessed by the Catholic Church. To begin the process of scheduling a date for Baptism, families are asked to be registered in the parish. Parents and Godparents are required to attend a Baptism Prep Class, and Godparents will need to provide a Letter of Eligibility from their current parish (where they reside). Baptisms are held most Sundays at 12:00pm, following the 10:30am Mass. For more information or to schedule a date, please call the parish office.

No Baptism date can be secured until all requirements are met.
