Dear Parish Family,

Christ is Risen! Indeed He IS Risen!! Happy Easter to all!

With this being the greatest Solemn Feasts of the entire Catholic Year. From Easter all of the Church's life springs anew! Next Sunday Is Divine Mercy Sunday, Jesus I Trust in YOU!

A Deacon of our Diocese is involved with a charity called "Blessing Bag Brigade", a 501c3 charity that helps the homeless. They have a very simple project he has invited our parish to participate in. He stopped by my office during Lent while on his way to make a delivery of items to a Jackson resident who will be distributing these items to the homeless.

The concept is pure simplicity. They place in a one gallon zip lock bag 10 items the homeless can use and carry with them. They are the following: (ONLY NEW items Please).

- A pair of NEW men's socks
- Snack/breakfast bar
- Bottle of Water
- Travel size shampoo
- Body wash/soap
- Toothbrush
- Travel size Toothpaste
- Travel size lotion
- Deodorant
- Disposable razor

Many of these items you probably have in your home. If you travel you probably have the hotel soaps, lotions and shampoo around, when you go to the dentist he gives you a toothbrush you probably don't use along with a small tube of toothpaste! A sample packet is in front of the Sacred Heart of Jesus if you would like to see what a Blessing Bag looks like.

What better way to share the joy of the Resurrection and be an ambassador of Mercy, then to become part of the blessing brigade! **You can fill a gallon zip lock bag with one of each of the above items and drop it off next Sunday, Divine Mercy Sunday**, in the gathering space. If you have a box of gallon size bags or a case of water or a box of granola bars or a bunch of NEW socks or small size items feel free to leave them for the Deacon as well.

As we celebrate the Resurrection of Christ, let us help someone to rise with dignity too!

Traditional Mass Catechesis by Fr. Jim Incense

The word incense comes from the Latin *incendere*, which means “to burn.” Frankincense is a fragrant extract from the sap of the *Boswellia* plant and its use is quite ancient. Since it had to be imported from faraway lands, it was an expensive sacrifice. Within the context of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, the burning of incense is a fitting gift for the King of Kings. This was even one of the gifts given to the baby Jesus by the Magi.

Whenever we burn incense, we are reminded of the words of Psalm 141: “Let my prayer be incense before you...” The ancient Israelite priests burned incense twice daily on a special altar in the Jerusalem Temple, and once a year on the Day of Atonement. On that day, the High Priest would place coals into a censer with two handfuls of incense and would process into the Holy of Holies, where the incense was burned before the mercy seat of the Ark of the Covenant, where the presence of the Lord was said to dwell.

Our Catholic faith teaches that Jesus is present among us whenever two or more are gathered in his name, but especially whenever the celebration of the Eucharist takes place. Jesus becomes truly, substantially present among us on the mercy seat of the altar. And so, we honor his presence with incense, as our prayers rise up before him.

This May, we will make a return to tradition by celebrating a traditional High Mass in English at its own time on Sundays. Stay tuned for more teachings on the Church’s tradition.
