Blessed New Year to all from the Clergy and Staff of the Parish.



Thank you to everyone who supported the Adopt-A-Family Program this year, another year of success in spreading holiday cheer. Big Thank you to the St. Vincent de Paul Society Volunteers, who organized, promoted and distributed the gifts!

Thank you to the Knights of Columbus who delivered Christmas presents and dinners! Hooray! Thank you to all those who contributed to the Advent "Funds for Food" to provide food for Seminarians at the National Seminary of St. Mary in Ggaba in Kampala Uganda! This was a huge success. To feed 233 Seminarians plus staff costs \$5 million Ugandan Shillings or \$1,300 US dollars. We raised enough to provide more than 10 week's worth of meals that is nearly 3 months of food! Thank you to everyone.

Thank you to all those who, after prayerful reflection and are able, increased their weekly offering to help the parish be financially stable.

Thank you to everyone who spread the spirit of Christmas in our community. Christ commanded us to love one another without condition. A Christian's good will and cheer is not dependent on the receiver, the onus is on the giver. It is our responsibility commanded by Christ. As Jesus tells us if we only give to those who give to us this makes us no better than thieves and liars, for even they give to those who give to them. The Lord commands us to be the light of the world, to illumine the darkness with his light, the light we received at baptism and to keep that flame of faith alive in our hearts until the Lord himself comes out to greet us with all the Saints of heaven! Thanks for being that light!

Thank you to all those who have made a decision to participate in the upcoming Synod listening sessions in January, February and March. The Holy Father wants to hear from you!! We will be conducting parish listening sessions with Focus Groups in the second week of January (these are by invitation) and expanding our outreach in February and March. We also plan to put together some virtual sessions and an online survey in March. We have 7 facilitators who can each handle groups of 6 people per session. There will also be large Diocesan Listening sessions with more capacity. Since the bulletin has to be printed too far in advance due to Covid and the holidays we will send Synod information out via Constant Contact as well.

May our New Year be one of great blessing, encouragement, support and compassion!

We NEED you. Can you HELP?

On December 14th, Bishop David M. O'Connell, C.M., conveyed an appeal from leaders in the United State of Conference of Catholic Bishops as relief work begins in Kentucky and other states that suffered an incalculable toll from the recent outbreak of tornadoes. Bishop O'Connell shared, "Catholics are encouraged to donate to recovery efforts and financial help for tornado victims by supporting the work of Catholic Charities USA via the website <u>www.catholiccharities.us</u>. " He added, "We pray for the souls of those who have died; for the comfort of their grieving loved ones; for the healing of the injured, and for the strength and perseverance of all those who lost their homes and livelihoods."

On the weekend of December 4th and 5th, I announced at all the Masses that in place of the Giving Tree we would have a box in front of the Statue of the Sacred Heart of Jesus as you enter Church with a sign that says, "Funds for Food for Ugandan Seminarians". Due to the pandemic the young men studying for the priesthood cannot leave the compound to go home at breaks and holidays and this has created a critical situation as all 230 students plus faculty and staff must be fed daily. Food is something we take for granted and it is abundant and plentiful in America but in many parts of the world this is not the case, particularly in Africa. Fr. Lazarus is struggling to provide food for these men. It costs the Seminary 5 million Uganda Shillings a week to feed 230+ people which is approximately \$1,300 US dollars a week. So for Advent, we are asking for funds to provide food for the Seminarians at Ggaba Seminary in Uganda. Checks should be made out to St. Aloysius Church and we ask that you write "Funds for Food Uganda " in the memo line and also on the envelope if you mail it or drop off at the office or Church. You have already raised 3.5 + week's worth of meals.

Prayer to St. Michael



Why Register at a Parish?

Your Parish Needs You and you Need Your Parish!!!

By registering at a parish, you are declaring your desire to be a part of a Catholic Faith community. If you have recently moved to Jackson or if you are a life-long Jackson resident, please consider registering at the parish. You can pick up a form in Church or the parish office or visit our website <u>www.saintaloysiuslonline.org</u> and download the form, fill it out and email it to us at parishoffice@saintaloysiusonline.org

Top Reasons to Register at a Parish

- A sense of belonging and identify in a parish community.
- It is a commitment to practice your faith
- Registration enables the parish pastor and staff to get to know you better, to welcome you and to minister to you. This is especially important during a time of crisis so that the pastoral staff can attend to your spiritual needs and the needs of your family.
- Registration helps you stay connected with your parish and helps your parish stay connected with you. Providing your contact information is important so we can provide you timely updates via email, direct mail, phone, etc. Also, if you use collection envelopes or online giving you may request a year-end statement of your donations for income tax purposes. Once you are registered, please notify the parish office of any changes in address, email or phone number. <u>Only registered active members are eligible for sponsor/godparent letters.</u>
- Census numbers may determine how many priests are assigned to a parish and how many Masses and enrichment programs are planned and scheduled.

What about children who are 18 years of age or older?

Children are considered members with their parents until they turn 18 years old. One they are 18 it is their responsibility to join a church family, participate in the Mass and to register as a member independent of their parents.

If you are not registered as a parishioner yet, or are unsure of your status, please complete and submit a Parish Registration Form which can be found in Church, at the parish office or downloaded via the parish website. You may place the completed form in the collection basket or drop it off at the parish office or via email to parishoffice@saintaloysiusonline.org.


