

Dear Parish Family-

The Knights of Columbus, the largest Catholic Men's fraternity in the world, was founded by Blessed Michael McGivney in the Basement of St. Mary's Church in New Haven, CT in the 19th Century. Blessed Fr. Michael McGivney was the Curate, what is today called the Parochial Vicar. The labor movement was just in its gestational stage and many men worked under harsh conditions and died young from dangerous work place accidents leaving behind young widows and children with no means of support. Blessed Fr. Michael McGivney rallied the men of the parish to form what in those days would have been called a 'fraternal benefit society'. It took as its themes Fraternity, Unity and Charity; they remain the hallmarks of the Order. Like many fraternal societies, which were immensely popular in the 19th Century, those wishing to enter the Order had to undergo an initiation which took three degrees to achieve full membership. Thus the men of the Order often refer to themselves as the "Third Degree". Today those steps of initiation have been much modernized and shortened into an hour long ceremony where all three degrees are received at once and the families are invited to attend the Degree ceremony. Like many 19th Century fraternal benefit societies, the ceremonies were initially secret. That is no longer the case. The 'Third Degree' makes up the bulk of the Knights of Columbus and they meet either on Church property or at halls owned by a 'Columbian Club'.

The Columbian Club is a separate legal entity that owns the building and usually operates a bar. When the Knights of Columbus meet at Columbian Club Halls they rent a small room within the building for their meetings called "the members room". Most Columbian Clubs have catering halls attached to their taverns as well.

The Knights of Columbus Third Degree are organized into "Councils" which have numbers. Our local Council is #6201, meaning it was the 6,201 Council to join the Order. The Councils also have an honorary title so #6201 is also known as the "Rev. Mitchell J. Cetkowski Council". Fr. Cetkowski I believe was the founder of St. Veronica's in Howell. The Council is a joint council for Jackson and Howell whose members primarily come from St. Veronica or St. Aloysius. Council 6201 meets twice a month at the Columbian Club on Bartley Road.

Jackson also has another Knights of Columbus Council which is a parish based Council that has their 'home' not at a Columbian Club but at a Parish, which is St. Monica's on West Veterans Highway. Their Council is #11529, meaning at the time they were founded they were the 11,529 Council to join the Order and they go by the honorary name of St. Monica.

Both of these Councils are of the Third Degree. Third Degree Councils have no distinctive 'uniform'. Their primary work is building fraternity among the members, maintaining unity and working charitably. The Knights of the Third Degree provide untold assistance to many charities and individuals. To this day they are still a Fraternal Benefit Society, meaning they provide their members with excellent Life Insurance Policies and other fiduciary benefits. The Third Degree Councils are led by "Worthy Grand Knights"; the current GK is Phil Capasso.

After Fr. McGivney's death, the leadership of the Knights of Columbus introduced a 4th Order called the Fourth Degree. Fourth Degree membership is a separate organization within the Knights of Columbus. They are organized into Assemblies which cover large geographic areas. To be a member of the Fourth Degree one must be a Third Degree member first. The Fourth Degree is probably the one most average Catholics and non-Catholics associate with the Knights of Columbus since they have a very distinctive 'uniform' worn only by those who are members of the "Color Corp." These are the gentlemen with the swords who provide an honorary escort at various Church functions and especially when a Bishop is present. Today their uniform has been modernized and is no longer so dramatic with plumes and capes. They now wear a blue blazer, grey slacks, a beret, and a sash with a sword which bears the emblem of the Fourth degree (a dove descending on the World over a red cross). The Fourth degree is made up of members from various Councils within the Assembly and they have their own Rite of Initiation. Their motto is "Patriotism" Their work is primarily fraternal and ordered toward providing patriotic support to our country. Their colors are red white and blue. Like the Third Degree, they use numbers and honorary naming. Our local Assembly is #658 and called Rev. Msgr. John Baldwin Assembly. The Assemblies are led by Faithful Navigator's; the current FN is Wayne Calsetta.

This extensive explanation is a long way to say thank you to all those of the Third and Fourth Degrees who took part in the "Bring a Hero Home" program of the Knights of Columbus from Councils #6201, #11529 and Assembly #658 and you the good people of Jackson who contributed to this program of the Knights of Columbus. The check was presented to the State Deputy James Stover (Leader for all of NJ) on Tuesday, January 3, 2023 in the member's room on Bartley Road. The "Bring a Hero Home" is a fundraiser each year to help a service member of limited means to travel home to his or her family to celebrate Christmas with their family. This year our Councils and Assembly raised \$10,000 which brought 3 Military Service members home to their families! Great work for a good cause!

This was a lengthy letter to say thank you but also to raise awareness about the Knights of Columbus. My father was a Life Member of both the Third and Fourth Degree, his son (your pastor) is also a Life Member, chaplain to the Council #6201 and Faithful Friar of Assembly #658.


