Dear Parish Family,

Monday began the liturgical season of Ordinary Time. Ordinary Time in the Church does not mean mundane or boring; it means the everyday, regular practice of faith. The liturgical color is green, life giving, evergreen, and eternal. It is the color of life itself, what the Doctor of the Church, St. Hildegard of Bingen, called 'Viriditas' or greening power. This was her hallmark to emphasize the vital connection between the "green" health of the natural world, and the holistic health of the human person. Ordinary Time is also the longest of all the liturgical seasons, broken up across the year with interspersed solemnities, feasts, festivals, and the seasons of Advent, Lent, Easter, and Christmas. After Christmas, the span of Ordinary Time is quite short from the Baptism of the Lord, until the start of Lent on Ash Wednesday (March 5). It picks up again following the Solemnity of Corpus Christi in June.



The year, 2025 is also an Ordinary Holy Year, Ordinary Holy Years occur every 25 years. The theme for this Holy Year is Hope. The Pope is free to declare Extraordinary Holy Years, the last one was the Holy Year of Mercy, and our Church was designated a Pilgrimage Church with Holy Doors, as decreed by the Pope. This Ordinary Holy Year of Hope, only the 4 Papal Basilica's will have Holy Doors, however, the Pope has asked each diocese to have Pilgrim Churches, six in our Diocese. Thus far, from the opening of the Holy Door at St. Peter's (the primary and most important of the doors), over 100,000 pilgrims have passed. Holy Doors represent Christ who tells us in the Gospel of John, "I am the door". Next month, I will lead 87 pilgrims through the Holy Door of St. Peter's in Rome.

If you are wondering, if not skip this section, where next year's pilgrimage will be going, it is France. We will be visiting important sites of French saints such as the parish Church of Blessed Fredrick Ozanam in Lyon, he is the founder of the St. Vincent de Paul Society; The Chapel of St. Vincent de Paul in Paris; St. Theresa of the Little Flower's convent in Lisieux, as well as the tombs of her, and her parents (both saints); the American Cemetery at Normandy; the Bayeux Tapestry; Paris, the city of Light; the Chapel of the Miraculous Metal, and many other holy places of the faith and culture such as Rouen Cathedral, which Claude Monet painted 30 times! Stay tuned for dates, prices, and exact itinerary. If you think you want to go, sign up as soon as the pilgrimage is officially announced, as we will only be taking 48 people, and it is expected to sell out quickly. The 2026 Pilgrimage will be one day longer, 12 days in France.

As we enter Ordinary Time, let the greening power of God allow you to grow, and be spiritually connected to all the life of this beautiful planet, moving each of us to fulfill God's command to us at the dawn of creation, to be good stewards of the earth, recalling that each of us is a pilgrim passing through on our way to heavenly glory! May our passage be as Pilgrims of Hope!



In the Catholic Church, the anointing of the sick is a sacrament that is administered to a Catholic "who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age". There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. The Sacrament may be received at any time during a person's illness, especially before surgery or treatment. We suggest calling to receive the Sacrament *before* a person is in grave danger of death as it is not always possible to have a priest available at the actual time of death. If you would like to schedule the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for a loved one, please contact the parish office.







What is a Jubilee Year?

A Holy Year or Jubilee is a time of special graces, pilgrimage, prayer, repentance and acts of mercy, based on the Old Testament tradition of a jubilee of rest, forgiveness, and renewal. (Lev. 25: 10-15) It is also a time to visit designated churches and shrines, recite special prayers, go to confession, and receive Communion to receive a plenary indulgence. The aim of a Holy

Year is holiness of life. It is convoked to strengthen faith, encourage works of charity and foster a consistent living of the faith. Pope Boniface VIII proclaimed the first Christian Jubilee in 1300. Since then, there have been twenty-six "ordinary" Holy Years, observed nearly every twenty-five or fifty years, the last being in 2000, proclaimed by St. John Paul II. Since the 16th century, a number of "extraordinary" Jubilees were proclaimed to commemorate the anniversaries of significant events. In the Diocese of Trenton the Holy Year begins December 24, 2024 and will conclude January 6, 2026.

The theme of the 2025 Jubilee is captured in its motto: Pilgrims in Hope and the title of the papal decree proclaiming the Holy Year: Spes non Confundit (Hope does not Disappoint) (Rom. 5:5) The Jubilee aims to inspire a collective sense of hope, particularly in light of recent global challenges like the COVID-19 pandemic, social disparities, and environmental issues. It summons us to be renewed in hope, and in turn, to be tangible signs of hope for those who experience hardship of any kind. The Jubilee coincides with the 1700th anniversary of the 1st Ecumenical Council (Nicea). This Council sought to preserve the Church's unity which was threatened by the denial of Christ's divinity. It approved the Creed we recite each Sunday at Mass.


