Dear Parish Family-

Murphy's Law is well intact! No sooner had the bulletin been transmitted to the printer explaining the delay in envelopes, when the envelopes appeared! I know there were many questions. If you give online, you do not receive envelopes or, if you did not use your envelopes last year, you did not receive envelopes this year. If you registered as a new parishioner after the cut-off date for printing (the end of October, 2023), you did not receive envelopes with your name on it, but were given a starter set when you registered. If you do not fit into one of these categories, please call the parish office and ask to speak to Sherri Kroesch, the Parish Business Manager, and she can assist you. We do have extra blank envelope boxes. The cost of printing and shipping is quite high, so the Parish Business Manager tries her best to remove families who move out of parish, died or do not use their envelopes to reduce the cost to the parish. Thank you for your understanding.

The re-roofing was completed before the big storms and so far it has been dry inside the Church. I watched snow slide down the roof and hit the snow guards so they are doing their job so far as well. Hopefully, this roofing material will hold up to the test of time better than the last one, which did not hold up at all even when it was new!

With all the improvements going on, I have people making recommendations for more improvements; believe me, I know all the improvements we need but funds are exceedingly limited and we are already heavily in debt. One of those is new lighting outside the entrance of the Church. We have lights but they all burned out at once and tracking down the bulbs has been a challenge. I had thought there was an electrical problem since we have electrical issues inside the Church. We had an electrician check them and he informed me they are all electrified but the bulbs burned out. It is strange to me that 12 LED bulbs all went out at the same time which leads me to conclude the cause was some kind of power surge. We lose power quite frequently which reeks havoc on our technology and timers. The outside bulbs are a retrofit LED and difficult to source. We will keep trying to obtain new bulbs which are nearly \$20 per bulb and we need 12 of them! In the meantime, if darkness is an issue, please consider a daytime Mass. Though the days are getting longer, the problem will naturally resolve in a few weeks and hopefully we can source bulbs before the days get shorter again in the fall.

The new doors are now fully operational, the security company connected the inside doors last week. The handicap door has been working for two weeks now. I had a few questions as to why all the doors cannot be automatic. Here is the simple answer; we simply replaced the one that existed, there was consideration of making them all automatic, however, the cost per door was \$5000 (not including labor, an electrician or, the cost of the door). With 8 doors, the total cost would have been \$40,000 for 8 mechanisms, not an insignificant amount. It was decided that we would just replace the existing handicap door at a cost of \$10,000+ (this cost is just for the mechanisms and bollard, it does NOT include the doors, it is only for the electric arms that moves the door open and closed).

While one parishioner thinks I waste money fixing things, decisions are prioritized and made taking into consideration what we need, versus what we want, as well as the cost. The same way most families make decisions!

In the Catholic Church, the anointing of the sick is a sacrament that is administered to a Catholic "who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age". There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. The Sacrament may be received at any time during a person's illness, especially before surgery or treatment. We suggest calling to receive the Sacrament *before* a person is in grave danger of death as it is not always possible to have a priest available at the actual time of death.

If you would like to schedule the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for a loved one, please contact the parish office.





Gavin is a 7 year old boy who is full of smiles, he loves the color green and dinosaurs. His talents include playing the piano and dancing. He's a fan of the Miami Dolphins and enjoys the Summer months swimming with family and friends. He is interested in mythical creatures such as elves, gnomes and leprechauns. Another thing Gavin enjoys is riding his scooter on sunny days.

In 2016 we welcomed our 2nd son, Gavin. At 6 months of age, he was diagnosed with Neurofibromatosis (NF) Type 1. At the age of 13 months, it was found by an MRI of the brain that Gavin had optic nerve gliomas (benign tumors). Just 3 months later we were told they had grown enough they were concerned about him going blind and they would need to start chemotherapy as soon as possible to save his sight. From September 2017-February 2019, we took Gavin weekly to CHOP in Philadelphia for his chemo treatments. The treatment was stopped due to an allergy that his body had formed to chemo. Along the way, he has encountered countless other health issues including gastroparesis, scoliosis, a large plexiform tumor in his abdomen, a few small tumors on his brain, low gross, and fine motor skills, and more. We were able to shrink the tumors and stop the growth on his optic nerve but unfortunately the large tumor in his abdomen is not operable as it is touching his heart, major veins, and arteries as well as his liver.

Shortly after Gavin finished his chemo in 2019, my husband Jeff began having trouble writing and using his right hand. Covid hit and it was difficult to see doctors. In late 2020, he started to have more trouble walking and began experiencing back and neck pain. After a thorough work up with an orthopedist and neurologist, he was diagnosed with progressive Multiple Sclerosis (MS). Unfortunately, with this he was forced into early retirement from his job as a corrections officer in Monmouth County. He currently is receiving infusions every 6 months to stop the progression.

In my wildest dreams I never imagined that I would have not one but two members of my family who were so sick with debilitating conditions. I pray every day that their conditions don't worsen, and they are able to function in day-to-day life. It's amazing that in that one second of your life when a diagnosis comes out of the doctor's mouth how much your life changes. Tammy Femiano


