

Dear Parish Family-

Welcome to "Word of God Sunday"! Pope Francis decreed in his Apostolic Letter given as a Motu Proprio (meaning at his own initiative) 'Aperuit Illis' that the 3rd Sunday of Ordinary Time be designated as Word of God Sunday for the purpose of spreading the practice of reading the Bible on a regular basis. The Apostolic Letter was issued on the Feast of St. Jerome who lived in Cave of the Nativity in Bethlehem and dedicated his life to illuminating and promoting the Scriptures, also translating the scriptures for people to read. St. Jerome famously said, "Ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ". You may have guessed by that quote St. Jerome was not subtle.



Pope Francis' intention in declaring this Word of God Sunday is to highlight the importance of reading, studying and praying with and through the Bible. One of the Church's ever ancient and ever new forms of prayer is called "Lectio Divina". It is a practice of reading, contemplating and praying the Word of God; it was promoted both by Pope Benedict XVI and Pope Francis. Below I have copied both Pope's explanations on how to pray Lectio Divina.

Pope Benedict XVI teaching on Lectio Divina comes from 'Verbum Domini', his post-Synodal exhortation: *"It opens with the reading (lectio) of a text, which leads to a desire to understand its true content: what does the biblical text say in itself? Without this, there is always a risk that the text will become a pretext for never moving beyond our own ideas. Next comes meditation (meditatio), which asks: what does the biblical text say to us? Here, each person, individually but also as a member of the community, must let himself or herself be moved and challenged. Following this comes prayer (oratio), which asks the question: what do we say to the Lord in response to his word? Prayer, as petition, intercession, thanksgiving and praise, is the primary way by which the word transforms us. Finally, lectio divina concludes with contemplation (contemplatio), during which we take up, as a gift from God, his own way of seeing and judging reality, and ask ourselves what conversion of mind, heart and life is the Lord asking of us? In the Letter to the Romans, Saint Paul tells us: "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may prove what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect" (12:2). Contemplation aims at creating within us a truly wise and discerning vision of reality, as God sees it, and at forming within us "the mind of Christ" (1 Cor 2:16). The word of God appears here as a criterion for discernment: it is "living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and spirit, of joints and marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart" (Heb 4:12). We do well also to remember that the process of lectio divina is not concluded until it arrives at action (actio), which moves the believer to make his or her life a gift for others in charity."* Pope Francis' teaching on Lectio Divina comes from his Encyclical 'Evangelii Gaudium', *"There is one particular way of listening to what the Lord wishes to tell us in his word and of letting ourselves be transformed by the Spirit. It is what we call lectio divina. It consists of reading God's word in a moment of prayer and allowing it to enlighten and renew us. This prayerful reading of the Bible is not something separate from the study undertaken by the preacher to ascertain the central message of the text; on the contrary, it should begin with that study and then go on to discern how that same message speaks to his own life. The spiritual reading of a text must start with its literal sense. Otherwise we can easily make the text say what we think is convenient, useful for confirming us in our previous decisions, suited to our own patterns of thought. Ultimately this would be tantamount to using something sacred for our own benefit and then passing on this confusion to God's people. We must never forget that sometimes "even Satan disguises himself as an angel of light" (2 Cor 11:14).*

153. In the presence of God, during a recollected reading of the text, it is good to ask, for example: "Lord, what does this text say to me? What is it about my life that you want to change by this text? What troubles me about this text? Why am I not interested in this? Or perhaps: What do I find pleasant in this text? What is it about this word that moves me? What attracts me? Why does it attract me?" When we make an effort to listen to the Lord, temptations usually arise. One of them is simply to feel troubled or burdened, and to turn away. Another common temptation is to think about what the text means for other people, and so avoid applying it to our own life. It can also happen that we look for excuses to water down the clear meaning of the text. Or we can wonder if God is demanding too much of us, asking for a decision which we are not yet prepared to make. This leads many people to stop taking pleasure in the encounter with God's word; but this would mean forgetting that no one is more patient than God our Father, that no one is more understanding and willing to wait. He always invites us to take a step forward, but does not demand a full response if we are not yet ready. He simply asks that we sincerely look at our life and present ourselves honestly before him, and that we be willing to continue to grow, asking from him what we ourselves cannot as yet achieve."

On this Word of God Sunday I offer you these reflections to encourage you to try Lectio Divina and to put into regular, even daily, practice the reading of the Scripture individually and as a family.
