Dear Parish Family-

Ash Wednesday is on Feb. 17 –five weeks away. Bishop O’Connell has asked pastors to remind people they are under no obligation to receive ashes and ask those who are sick and high risk to stay home. The reception of ashes is a custom, a nice way to start Lent but never obligatory, even before Covid-19. So if you don’t absolutely need to come out, stay home. We will live stream the day. There will be limited hours and only one Mass at the regular time during Covid, at 9am. We will have two additional prayer services one at noon and one at 4pm. Ashes will be distributed only by myself and Fr. Jim. We will follow all of the precautions and directives of the Diocese Covid19 Committee and Health Officials. We will be using a slurry mix of ashes and holy water, applied to the forehead using a q-tip, one q-tip per person. We will say the formula only once for everyone gathered and impose ashes silently and you must depart immediately without gathering in any size group to chat.

I have heard from quite a few people that it is at present difficult to get a reservation for the Covid-19 vaccine. While this is highly frustrating for those trying to get a vaccine, it is a hopeful sign that people are willing to be vaccinated. There were quite a few skeptics but it appears logic has set in, after all vaccines have prevented mumps, rubella, polio, diphtheria, bacterial influenza, measles, rotavirus, chicken pox, tetanus, whooping cough and Hepatitis A & B to name a few. Imagine a world without vaccines? So many children would die in our country every year without vaccines, and still do in the developing world, from diseases that are easily preventable. We are blessed to live in a country with access to vaccines. The Church supports the use of vaccines and encourages her sons and daughters to get vaccinated for the Common Good of Society.

I commend the highly organized way our Ocean County Leadership have been vaccinating people, what they lack are vials of the vaccine. The County was well prepared and could vaccinate far more people each day if they had greater access to the vaccine. Hopefully our new President Biden will move the government bureaucracy along, just as President Trump moved development of a vaccine along in record time. When our Government officials want to they can make things happen, let us encourage them to do so in a supportive way!

- The Obligation to attend Mass is suspended Until Further Notice. - Live Streaming of all Masses is continuing. \*\*\*Those in high risk categories and those with pre-existing conditions are asked to stay home and participate through Live Stream.\*\*\*

In person Mass attendance requires:

- ✓ **Mask must cover both the nose and the mouth**
- ✓ 6 feet of social distancing
- ✓ Sit only in pews marked with green tape
- ✓ Red tape areas off limits. Remember green equals 'go' and red equals 'stop'!
- ✓ Bathrooms are for *emergency use only*, please go before leaving your home.
- ✓ Church opens 15 minutes before Mass.
- ✓ Communion is distributed after Mass ends and you must depart immediately.
- ✓ If you watch via Live Stream, you can come to Church for Communion.
- ✓ No gathering in any size group anywhere on our property.
- ✓ It is requested you take Communion in the hand but can be taken on the tongue.

The State currently permits 25% of capacity which is 286 people per Mass in our building. The highest number of people at Mass has been at 10:30am where we have reached 23% of capacity. To assist you in assessing the risk the following most recent numbers may be of help to you.

- Baptisms, Weddings, Funerals and other Celebrations limited to 50 people this number includes family, clergy, outside attendants, anyone breathing and all the restrictions found above for weekend Masses.

***The Gift of Bread and Wine*** – Can be offered for one week (Sunday through Saturday) for a donation of \$50.00.

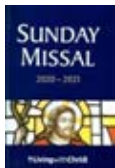

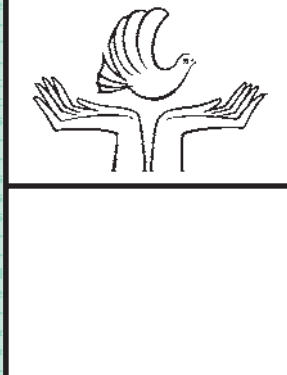
