Dear Parish Family,

I asked our Parish Catechetical Leader, Mrs. Jennifer Petrillo, to share what our teens said about their November NCYC experience for anyone unable to attend their presentation on December 8th.

Every two years, the National Catholic Youth Conference (NCYC) is held in Indianapolis, Indiana. The conference includes several days of inspiring talks, music, relevant breakout sessions, opportunities for Confession, Eucharistic adoration, Mass, and the chance to encounter thousands of fellow Catholic teens from throughout the United States. NCYC 2025 was unique, however, since our itinerary included an event that had never taken place at the conference before: a “digital encounter” with Pope Leo XIV. Our Holy Father Pope Leo set aside an hour of his time to meet with us in what was essentially a giant Zoom call between the Pope in Rome and us 16,000 pilgrims in Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis. Five teens from different states had been chosen in advance to ask questions of the Holy Father, and to respond to what he shared with them.

The teens of our parish were definitely impacted by this momentous encounter. They heard Pope Leo proclaim that they are the present of the Church, not just the future. They were affirmed and encouraged by our Holy Father, who highlighted the importance of their staying involved and sharing their gifts with their parishes. He emphasized the necessity of strengthening their relationship with Jesus, and offered simple, practical suggestions for how to cultivate that relationship. In all of his responses, Pope Leo XIV addressed the young people with tender, fatherly care and wisdom. The teens from our parish and I agreed that our Holy Father seemed to be visibly moved by the sight of so many teens who were enthusiastic about their Catholic faith, and eager to “meet” the Vicar of Christ. We could sense the love that he had for us, as he smiled warmly and offered his time to us so generously. Throughout his talk, the Holy Father continued to point teens towards a relationship with Christ. He mentioned how happy he was to see that the NCYC schedule included opportunities for Eucharistic adoration, Mass, and Confession. So, I am sure that Pope Leo would have been very happy to hear that among the teens in our parish’s group, Eucharistic adoration and Confession were two of the highlights that they mentioned during their presentation. As their youth minister, I was so glad to hear that they had opened their hearts to the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist, and to the healing power of Confession. One of our teens shared specifically how the music during Eucharistic adoration was really impactful for her, and that she had never had the opportunity to pray with music in adoration before. Indeed, we were blessed with a very talented music ministry at NCYC, who helped us really enter into times of prayer throughout the conference.

Over the course of our time at NCYC, we had the opportunity to hear several inspiring talks from a variety of noteworthy Catholic speakers. One of our teens mentioned how he really enjoyed the talk from Meg Hunter-Kilmer, who poignantly shared stories of saints from dramatically different backgrounds, encouraging us to recognize that God has a plan for each of us and that with His grace,

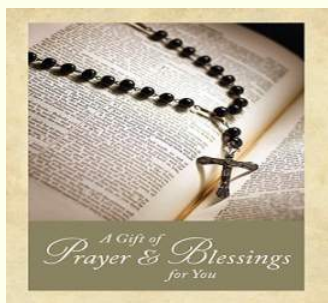

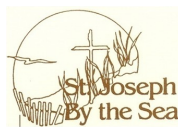

holiness is possible. One talk that had a profound impact on our group was given by Sister Miriam James Heidland, a member of the Society of Our Lady of the Most Holy Trinity. On a personal note, this was the keynote that I was most looking forward to, since I know firsthand the gift that Sister Miriam James has, for inviting listeners to experience the healing of Christ on a deep level. I was so grateful that our teens were open to hearing her message, which expressed the compassion that Christ has for each one of us, and His desire to bring healing to all the wounds of our hearts. Sister's talk was especially meaningful because it led up to our time of Eucharistic adoration. Please know that the talk does bring up some sensitive topics, as Sister Miriam James vulnerably shares her own experience of trauma, and the ways that she personally has experienced the transforming power of Christ's love.

Another highlight that our teens mentioned was getting to "trade" various items, and meet and talk with other teens from around the country. At each NCYC, it is customary to bring items to trade with fellow participants . . . fun hats, bracelets, holy cards, pins, or other items that represent the region where each group is from. These small exchanges give teens the opportunity for a moment of encounter, and contribute to a fun, cheerful atmosphere throughout the conference.

I wanted to close by expressing our group's deep gratitude to our incredibly generous parishioners who made it possible for our teens to attend NCYC. I am amazed by the overwhelming financial and spiritual support that we received. You have invested not just in the future of the Church, but in the present. The more that our young people have opportunities to experience their faith as a living reality, the more that they will be witnesses of Christ in our world, sharing the beauty and joy of our Catholic faith.
