Dear Parish Family-

I thought I would share with you some statistics given to pastors by our Diocesan Chancellor Mrs. Terry Ginther. They are Mass attendance numbers from 2010-2022.



The Diocese in the 1990's began to build Churches in excess of 1000 seats with a view to a continuing shortage of priests, thus our Church was constructed to hold nearly 1,200 people (1,145 to be exact). Interestingly enough the decline in Mass attendance started in 2010, just a year after the New Church was constructed.

Mass attendance for 2010 was 2,926 people per weekend.

Just five years later in 2015 it had declined to 2,199 people per weekend.

By 2019 Mass attendance declined to 1,116 people per weekend.

It reached a low in April of 2020 during the pandemic of 502 people per weekend.

By 2021 attendance post pandemic began to rise to 885 people per weekend

By 2022 it rose to 1,232.

These numbers are averages and taken from the October Counts we submit each year to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops.

Multiple factors have contributed to these falling numbers. There has been a major shift in the Catholic populations of the North East to the South over the last decade. There continues to be a trend toward secularization in our nation affecting all religious groups. The Pandemic caused major declines in attendance across all religious bodies.

For Jackson in particular we have also been experiencing a dramatic demographic change from Christian to Orthodox Judaism over the last 6 or so years, the Asbury Park Press reports there are over 5000 new Orthodox Jewish Families that have moved into Jackson.

All of these factors contribute to the overall effect of lower attendance rates.

We also received a Deanery wide chart of Mass attendance declines, our parish falls about in the middle with a 5 year (2017-2022) decline of 33%; interestingly, St. Monica here in Jackson had the same 33% decline. One parish in the deanery had only a 21% decline while one parish experienced a 40% decline, one a 46% decline and two with 49% decline over the same time period.

Of the five largest parishes in the Deanery we had the second lowest decline at 33%; one parish had a 25% decline, one 35% decline, one a 46% decline and one a 49% decline.

The Mass attendance decline across the deanery (13 Churches) was from a low of 21% to a high of 49%.

Some sobering statistics for sure but they do not tell the whole story nor do they reveal the strength of the faith of those who come to Mass weekly. They do give us food for thought.
