Dear Parish Family,

I have not written about the Synod recently so here is a little update. I have written extensively about the Synod and we have finally gotten it off the ground on the local level. Last week we had our first focus groups.

The Holy Father wanted to particularly hear from youth and how nice that the first focus group in the parish to take part in the Synod process were our teenagers! The notes were e-mailed to me from this first focus group without any identifiers. In fact I did not even know who attended or even what day the focus group was held. The notes do not identify those who spoke; they are only referred to as Participant 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, or 6 in accord with the Synod Committee's instructions. Their reflections were wonderful, inspiring and challenging.

The various ministries, Committees, organizations etc have all received a letter from me inviting them to ask 6 members of their respective group to come participate in a focus group. We have begun to fill in dates and times and assign Facilitators and Note Takers for these sessions. While our team had set Mid-January as our goal to start we were slightly delayed but only by a few days. Once we get the hang of it and have a few sessions under our belts I am sure things will run like clockwork.

The process is really very simple, 6 people come. Three questions will be presented, all 6 get a chance to respond and listen. These Synod meetings are singularly about Listening. The role of the facilitator is to keep the group on schedule and ensure all 6 people get a chance to respond to each question. The Note Taker records the answers, then will summarize the answer and send them to the Diocesan Synod Committee. Hopefully the sessions will last just one hour to one hour and fifteen minutes.

There will be no rebuttals, attempts to correct, teach, evangelize or debate. The Sessions are about listening to one another. Whatever information is given by the participants will be responded to the Holy Father in his Letter following the end of the Synod in 2023.

When you have the opportunity I hope you will come to a session, the Holy Father wants to hear from you! Hopefully by mid-February we will have general sign-ups with varying days and times to hopefully accommodate most people's schedule.

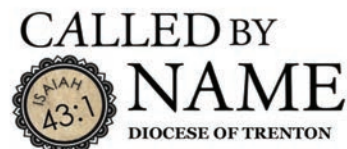

To that end, we are making a few changes to how you can make your online donations. We are excited to announce that we have transitioned the new ParishSOFT Giving platform. This program allows for an easier experience for you, as well as for the parish office. The new giving platform can be accessed through our website at www.saintaloyisiusonline.org. Click on the GIVING tab in the blue bar at the top of the page and then on the red Donate Today button.

For all active recurring donors, we have transitioned your recurring gifts from our prior eGiving platform, My Own Giving, over to ParishSOFT Giving. When logging in for the first time, it is important to use the same email address as your original My Own Giving account and follow the set-up steps below. Your previous recurring gift in My Own Giving was cancelled automatically when we moved to ParishSOFT Giving and your recurring gift will now be processed in our new system at the same frequency and amount as before. Once you login to the new system you will be able to manage any recurring gifts that are active for you.

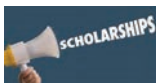

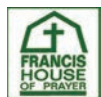
