Dear Parish Family-



It was nice to see so many smiling and even laughing faces after reading last week's bulletin message! It's good to have a laugh!

The Roofing work on Gonzaga Hall (Old Church) was delayed due to weather. Wednesday it snowed and then rained all day so no work could be done. On Friday the ambient temperature was 5 and high winds prevented work from being done. Worked commenced once again on Monday Feb. 6, this work was directly over the Church office entrance and thus the office entrance was closed most of the day while the old roof material was being removed. I apologize for the inconvenience.

On Thursday January 19 a pre-bid meeting was held by the Roofing Consultant in the cafeteria with 5 commercial roofing companies who were bidding on the C & D Wings of the school building. Bids were due by the week of Feb. 1. On Monday afternoon February 6, myself and the Parish Business Manager, Sherri Kroesch, met with the roofing consultant to open the bids for the C & D Wing roof project. The lowest bid was submitted by Strober-Wright of Lambertville, NJ and they were informed on the same day. A schedule will be worked out with them to begin the work.

During roofing of the C & D Wings, the parking lot behind the cafeteria will be used as a construction staging site for materials and equipment. The equipment, materials and dumpster must be placed in proximity of the work and cannot be sited on soil (the weight causes them to sink). The C & D Wing work is expected to start in March/April and will take 3 weeks per wing for a total of 6 weeks; this is dependent on weather and could be longer or shorter. This project will be a little more involved due to the school being in session and will require coordination between the parish, Alpha School and the roofer to ensure a smooth project.

This weekend the Diocese marks World Marriage Sunday and we will have a blessing as well as a Holy Hour. It is also Super Bowl Sunday, may the best team win!

Next Sunday, February 18/19 is the kick off of the Diocese of Trenton's Annual Appeal. The theme of this year's appeal was chosen by Bishop David M. O'Connell to coincide with the United States Catholic Bishop's multi-year Eucharistic Revival, "We are the Body of Christ". Vatican II taught Christ is present in the sacrifice of the Mass, in the person of the minister (it is the same Christ who formerly offered himself on the cross that now offers himself by the ministry of priests) and most of all under the Eucharistic Species. He is present in the sacraments by His power, in such a way that when someone baptizes, Christ himself baptizes. He is present in his word, for it is He himself who speaks when the Holy Scriptures are read in the Church. Finally, He is present when the Church prays and sings, for He himself promised: Where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there in their midst.

Please consider a gift to the Annual Appeal, this year after much feedback from donors, the appeal categories are three: Eyes of Christ, Feet of Christ, Hands of Christ and new ways of electronic donating have been added as requested by younger donors.

Jake Hebert is an energetic, happy three year old who loves to play with his five year old sister, Josie. His favorite things include fire trucks, Spider Man, Blippi, and construction tools and trucks!

Jake’s cancer journey started in February 2022 with frequent unexplained fevers and right leg pain. After many months of appointments with different specialists he was finally diagnosed in November 2022 with Ewing Sarcoma, a type of bone cancer, in his right leg. This cancer is very aggressive, but by the grace of God it has not spread to other parts of his body.



Jake began a three-month course of chemotherapy the day after Christmas. From there he will undergo surgery to try and remove as much of the cancer as possible. If the tumor responds well to the chemo, the doctors are hopeful that the surgery will not require amputation. After surgery Jake will receive another four months of chemo. His chemo days are 12 hours long with each 2-week cycle requiring as many as five days in a row and requires an hour trip each way to Children’s Hospital of Philadelphia. Throughout the treatment, Jake’s leg will remain in a full cast that wraps around his waist to prevent his leg from breaking, which limits his mobility but he does his best to get around and chase his sister. He remains in good spirits and charms the nurses and doctors at CHOP whenever he is there.

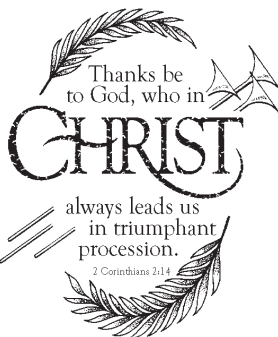
