Dear Parish Family,

The World Wide Synod of Bishop's First Phase, of a three phase process, has begun in the Parishes of the Diocese of Trenton. Our parish has trained Facilitators and Note Takers who have been working with Focus groups. These focus group attendees have voluntarily come from the various ministries, study groups, organizations, teams, and such that regularly meet in the parish. This is the first part of our parish role out of the Synodal Process.

The Second Phase of our roll out, general sign-ups begins this coming week. You are invited to come to a Synod meeting to answer 3 brief questions. Your responses will be recorded without any identifying information and sent on to the Diocesan Synod Committee who will collate and redact them into common theme, then pass them on to the National Conference of Catholic Bishop's Synod Committee for reflection and discussion at the National Level.

Your participation is key to the success of the Synod Process. The Holy Father, Pope Francis, desires and invites everyone to participate. To that end, I am including the days and times when trained Facilitators will be available in the month of February. We will also have sessions in March which will be published the beginning of March.

Please consider contributing to this unprecedented and largest consultation in the history of humanity! You voice counts and the Holy Father wants to hear from you!

What to expect: You will be greeted and grouped with up to 5 other parishioners. There will be an opening prayer, introductions, and then each person will answer the first question, a pause with silence, the second question, a period of silence and then the 3rd question. There will be a conclusion and the sessions will last between 1 hour to 1 hour and 15 minutes. These are listening sessions so there will be no responses, no rebuttals, no debating, no challenging, no attempt to convert you, change your opinion, catechize you or evangelize you. Your answers will be received with respect and sent on without commentary. Please know your thoughts are *important* and we want to hear them without judgment.

Journeying Together through the Synod – What is the Spiritual Conversation Method?

Synod listening sessions take around 60-90 minutes and follow the Spiritual Conversation Method. This method is based on a form of "communal apostolic discernment" that began with the Jesuits and has been in use for more than 500 years. It has a few steps: begin with prayer and reflection on your experience; share your experience in a small group; listen closely to others' stories; sit in silence to take in all you have heard; comment on what moved you, resonated with you; talk about how Spirit may be prompting action. 
