Three roofing projects are now complete; the old office building, the garage and Gonzaga Hall. We had heavy rain and no leaks to my knowledge. Three more roofs to go, C Wing, D Wing and the new Church; the C and D wings contract has been awarded and planning is underway, hopefully work will begin as early as March. The roofing consultant continues to work on project specifications for the new church roof and I expect a pre-bid meeting sometime in the late spring to early summer.





forever and ever. Amen.








