Dear Parish Family,

One week down, five more to go! We enter the second week of Lent. Many people endure some sort of suffering and pain, whether physical, mental, emotional, spiritual, addictive etc. The spiritual writer Henri J. Nouwen writes,



“Your pain is deep, and it won’t go away...your call is to bring that pain home. As long as your wounded part remains foreign to your adult self, your pain will injure you as well as others. Yes, you have to incorporate your pain into yourself and let it bear fruit in your heart and the hearts of others. This is what Jesus means when he asks you to take up your cross. He encourages you to recognize and embrace your unique suffering and to trust that your way to salvation lies therein. Taking up your cross means, first of all, befriending your wounds and letting them reveal your own truth.”

Nouwen suggests that instead of ignoring the pain and suffering, we should turn it into something good by embracing it and allowing it to be redemptive. Take up the Cross with courage.

Pope Benedict XVI, reflecting on a line from the Our Father where we ask God to deliver us from trials, offers this spiritual advice:

“When we pray (the Lord’s Prayer) we are saying to God: I know that I need trials so that my nature can be purified. When you decide to send me these trials, when you give evil some room to maneuver, as you did with Job, then please remember that my strength goes only so far. Don’t overestimate my capacity. Don’t set too wide the boundaries within which I may be tempted, and be close to me with your protecting hand when it becomes too much for me. ... WE make this prayer in the trustful certainty that Saint Paul has articulated for us: ‘God is faithful, and he will not let you be emptied beyond your strength, but with the temptation will also provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure it.’ (1Cor. 10:13)”

Some things in life are hard to resolve. In these moments, we can think about “pondering” in the Biblical sense, like when Mary pondered “all these things in her heart”. In Hebrew tradition, pondering is not intellectual, it means patiently holding the issue and its tension within your soul. When Mary stood at the cross, she could not save her son or protest his innocence. As Fr. Ron Rolheiser reflects, *“She is carrying a great tension that she is helpless to resolve and must simply live with....Thus, to ponder, biblically, is to stand before life’s great mysteries the way Mary stood before the various events of Jesus life, including the way she stood under the Cross...it is willingness to carry tension as Mary did.”*

These reflections can help us during Lent as we work to purify our hearts, turn away from sin, and stay faithful to the Gospel.


