Dear Parish Family,

This coming Wednesday, March 6, marks the beginning of the Holy Penitential Season of Lent.

The schedule for the distribution of Ashes on Ash Wednesday: Mass at 8:30am, where ashes are distributed after the homily, Liturgy of the Word Service at 12noon, and Liturgy of the Word service at 4pm.

The receiving of Ashes is a custom to start Lent, it is a sign and symbol of my need as a sinner to repent and live a life worthy of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. They are made from burnt palm, there is nothing magical in their composition, there is no salvation in their composition, receiving them is not a Willie Wonka golden ticket to heaven. They are a sign and symbol of a sinner in need of God's mercy and a way to start Lent with the right spiritual disposition. They are imposed on human beings only, who have soul, not on animals. There is no sin if you don't "get da ashes". There is no requirement and it is not a holy day of obligation. You are encouraged and invited to come on Ash Wednesday to orient yourself to the three Pillars of Lent; Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving.


On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, Catholics, under pain of sin, are obligated to fast and abstain from meat. Fasting in the Catholic Tradition consists of two small meals and one large meal; the two smaller meals cannot exceed the total of the one large meal. So, it is not an all day starve-a-thon, it is meant to feel the pangs of hunger and remind us to hunger for God alone, and to be mindful of the poor. It is not meant to be a torture event. Certainly you are welcome to fast in a more strict way, either abstaining from food the entire day or only having one meal, this is an edifying custom, but not required. Liquids do not break the fast, so one may drink liquid all day.

On the Fridays of Lent, Catholics are obligated to abstain from meat under pain of mortal sin. Forgetting to abstain on one day does not create a serious sin, however, failing to observe the Fridays as a whole, is a serious offense. In this day and age it is pretty easy to not eat meat; there are many meatless options which are even healthier options. Catholics are encouraged to abstain from meat on another day if they chose as part of their personal Lenten devotion, but there are no requirements outside of Fridays.

It is the custom of Lent to chose something to sacrifice ("give up") during the whole of Lent, place a monetary value on what you have given up for Lent, and offering that as an alms giving to the poor. As children, we always gave up chocolate or candy, but anything we are fond of can be chosen. I can recall my father telling us their parish priest one year asked everyone, as a parish, to give up TV. My dad gave up TV for 40 days, but started to get annoyed because every Sunday the priest used a TV show episode in his homily. So my dad said, "Obviously he did not give up TV as we got updates on the shows every Sunday!"

Giving up something for Lent is a noble practice and again reminds us to long for God. Lent is all about turning toward the Lord, which also means increasing our prayer life, going to confession (don't forget to fulfill your Easter Duty), attend daily Mass, say a rosary, make the Stations of the Cross on Fridays, privately or at the parish at 7pm on Fridays. Pick up and use the Magnificat Lenten prayer aid or use a prayer App. Lent is a wonderful opportunity to renew our relationship with God and up our spiritual life a bit. Don't let it pass by without engaging in the three pillars; Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving.

Ash Wednesday—Wednesday, March 5

Ash Wednesday begins the Season of Lent, and is a day of fast and abstinence. Ashes will be distributed at Mass and at both Services.

SOUP AND STATIONS OF THE CROSS—Stations of the Cross every Friday in Lent at 7:00pm in the Church beginning Friday, March 7th. Join groups for a simple soup supper at 6:00pm in Morello Hall before Stations of the Cross. BYOB (Bring Your Own Bowl).

EUCARISTIC ADORATION—Join the Men's Group each Friday in Lent (March 7, 14, 21, 28, April 4 and 11) from 9am-3pm in Gonzaga Chapel and strengthen your faith through Eucharistic Adoration. We can show our devotion to God in many ways, but in Eucharistic Adoration, we spend time worshipping the true presence of Christ in the Eucharist.

Lenten Regulations

The days of FAST (only one full meal) and ABSTINENCE (no meat) are **Ash Wednesday and Good Friday**. No dispensations are granted on these solemn days except for reason of sickness or those provided in canon law below. ALL OTHER FRIDAYS OF LENT are days of ABSTINENCE.

The pastor of a parish has the faculty to give a dispensation to *individual* parishioners in his parish and the Diocesan Bishop alone has the authority to dispense groups of Catholics but only for a serious reason.

Those who are automatically dispensed from fast and abstinence regulations outside the age limits noted below include: the physically or mentally ill, especially individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also included in the dispensation are women who are pregnant or nursing. In all cases, common sense should prevail, and ill persons should not further jeopardize their health by fasting.

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to FAST (only one full meal) as noted above. From the age of 14, people are also obliged to ABSTAIN: this obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat.

The obligation to observe the laws of fast and abstinence is a serious one for Catholics. Failure to observe one penitential day in itself is not considered a serious sin. It is the intentional failure to observe any penitential days at all, or a substantial number of penitential days, that must be considered a serious matter.

The obligation, the privilege really, of receiving the Eucharist at least once a year --- often called "**Easter duty**" --- for those in the state of grace should still be fulfilled during the period from the **First Sunday of Lent, March 8-9, 2025, to Trinity Sunday, June 14-15, 2025**.

All Catholics are encouraged, to go to Confession, especially those who are conscious of serious sin, and to make use of the sacrifices and traditions that have always been part of our Lenten practices in the Church.

Church's law does permit this precept to be fulfilled at another time during the year when there is a just cause.

In the Catholic Church, the anointing of the sick is a sacrament that is administered to a Catholic "who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age". There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. The Sacrament may be received at any time during a person's illness, especially before surgery or treatment. We suggest calling to receive the Sacrament *before* a person is in grave danger of death as it is not always possible to have a priest available at the actual time of death. If you would like to schedule the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for a loved one, please contact the parish office.
