The Synod on Synodality process is underway across the Diocese and our parish has completed 2 months of Synod Listening Sessions, there is only one more month to go before the Diocesan Phase closes. Published in the bulletin are the dates currently available for anyone wishing to participate. The process is confidential, though not secretive. No identifying information is passed on to the pastor or the Synod Committee, only an anonymous review sheet containing general comments. Thus far, the notes of the sessions I have reviewed have been full of insightful commentary on Church life. Generally there are what the Catholic and secular press call "culture war issues" on all the hot topics of the church today, deeply reflective commentary on how the Holy Spirit moves in the soul, a strong over arching desire for community building, the joy of getting to know other parishioners through the process, a shared recognition of mutual struggles and joys in faith to name but a few of the major expressions. Overall the process has been enlightening. Don't miss this wonderful opportunity to be part of the largest consultation in human history!

Last week I received and read the roof observation report prepared by the James D. Cummins & Company. This is the roofing consultant hired by the Parish to review the New Church Roof, the Old Church Roof and the former Rectory Roof.

The section on the New Church makes plain that the Standing Seam Metal Roof is quite literally coming apart at the seams, the report states, "The roof is essentially pulling itself apart and will continue to do so". This is due primarily to three factors; one the manufacture requires the metal seams' to be crimped by machine to achieve water tightness and the seams were crimped by hand. The second factor is the constant movement of the roof in all directions and this constant flexing is causing the roof to come apart at the seams. The third factor is the design of the roof which catches high winds in our location. All of these factors have allowed water to leak into the building in more than 50+ locations. The roof has leaked since before the building was occupied in 2009. These leaks have progressively worsened over the last 13 years. The Consultant recommends the entire Standing Seam Roof be removed and a "more flexible thermoplastic single ply material that can withstand the constant movement of the building." Approximate cost to temporarily repair it until a roofing contract is signed and material ordered equals \$14,000.00. The cost to replace the roof is estimated at 1 Million dollars.

The report also looked at the Old Church Roof which began leaking about a year ago in approximately 20 places, depending on wind direction. The report found there were 3 roofs in violation of Internal Building Codes and most likely has caused the early failure of the roof. The recommendation is for the gutters to be replaced with larger gutters as well. The total cost of roof and gutters is estimated at \$106.000.00.

The old rectory roof also has 3 roofs and undersized gutters. Replacement is estimated at \$30,000.00. The report notes there may be damage under all of these roofs requiring repair/replacement and those costs are unknown at this time. The grand total estimate for all roof work is one million one hundred and fifty thousand dollars. We do not have funds for these projects; I will be discussing the report with the Parish Finance Council at our next meeting and proceed according to their recommendations.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

During the days and weeks of penance that lie ahead --- from *Ash Wednesday, March 2, 2022 until Holy Thursday, April* 14, 2022 --- the Catholic Church throughout the world commemorates the penitential season of Lent ending with the Sacred Triduum of Holy Week. The model Jesus gave us for "these forty days" was his own experience in the desert and the temptations that followed him there where he encountered Satan face to face. And yet, Jesus, there in the desert --- alone, fasting and in intense prayer --- beat back the devil and triumphed over temptation, as strong and as unrelenting as it was throughout those forty days.

We enter the desert of Lent like Jesus, led by the Holy Spirit, to face our devils, our temptations head on. But we are not alone. The Lord Jesus Christ is with us. And so, too, is the Church, the entire community of faith observing Lent. Here is what the Catholic Church in the United States requires of us as baptized Catholics:

- 1. The days of FAST (only one full meal) and ABSTINENCE (no meat) are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. No dispensations are granted on these solemn days except for reason of sickness or those provided in canon law below. The pastor of a parish has the authority to give a dispensation to individual parishioners in his parish. The Bishop alone has the authority to dispense groups of Catholics but only for a serious reason.
- 2. Those who are automatically dispensed from fast and abstinence regulations outside the age limits noted below include: the physically or mentally ill, especially individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also included in the dispensation are women who are pregnant or nursing. In all cases, common sense should prevail and ill persons should not further jeopardize their health by fasting (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops).

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to FAST (only one full meal) as above. From the age of 14, people are also obliged to ABSTAIN (no meat: this obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat).

The obligation to observe the laws of fast and abstinence is a serious one for Catholics. Failure to observe one penitential day in itself is not considered a serious sin. It is the intentional failure to observe any penitential days at all, or a substantial number of penitential days, that must be considered a serious matter.

The obligation, the privilege really, of receiving the Eucharist at least once a year --- often called "Easter duty" --- for those in the state of grace should still be fulfilled during the period from the **First Sunday of Lent, March 5-6, 2022 to Trinity Sunday, June 12, 2022.** However, the Church's law does permit this precept to be fulfilled at another time during the year when there is a just cause.

I want to encourage all Catholics, especially those conscious of serious sin, to go to confession and to make use of the sacrifices and traditions that have always been part of our Lenten practices in the Church.

We do, indeed, fast and pray with the Lord Jesus and with our fellow Catholics. May this Lent be a time of penance leading to grace and joy for us all at Easter.

What is the Spiritual Conversation Method? How will sharing my story become part of the Synod?

A report from each listening session will be given to the Diocesan Synod Committee. It is their task to learn from these responses about the circumstances in which we, as Church, are doing a good job journeying together and where we could do a better job of accompanying one another in faith. They will also gather the "fruit" of discernment in terms of what the Spirit might be saying to the Church through the stories shared. These elements will form the basis for the diocesan report.

Ease diocese will submit a report to the United State Conference of Bishops by June. These will be examined at the national level by region, then collated into the continental report. The Synod office at the Vatican will use the USCCB report and reports from bishops' conferences around the world to create the preparatory document for the Synod of Bishops in October, 2023.

their way back upon their return. Parents are welcome to join with their children and are required to if their child needs special supervision.








