Dear Parish Family-

We enter the third week of the six weeks of Lent. Tuesday's at 3pm I am offering reflections on suffering and tribulation in the Christian journey of life both live and live stream. You need not attend all of them, each is an independent reflection loosely connected to the previous week's reflection. On Friday's we offer Stations of the Cross at 3pm both live and live stream. Due to the Covid-19 restrictions in place we cannot 'walk' the stations so we have gotten creative using a Smart TV. We 'move' from station to station electronically, this also helps those at home who are watching to be part of the stations. We started on the first Friday of Lent using a projector but the age of the equipment created visual problems so we switched to Smart TV which was cheaper than buying either a new projector or a new projector bulb and we have better color saturation! Stations of the Cross this year are the ones found in the Magnificat Lenten Companion. This is the booklet we usually distribute for Lent but could not due to Covid. Knowing that many parishioners have a yearly subscription to Magnificat meant that at least some folks could bring their own copy and follow along.

For those who don't have their own copy, you can obtain the Lenten edition for \$2.99, they have several different versions depending on your device.

Every Easter we have the Blessing of the Easter Foods on Holy Saturday. Last year this was not permitted due to the shut down. This year we are being discouraged from holding it. However, we have been brainstorming a way to preserve the tradition and still do it safely.

So this Holy Saturday April 3 at 1pm we will hold the Blessing of the Easter Foods but in a different way. You will make your basket up, place it in the Trunk of your Car, come to the Church parking lot, park in every other space, be sure there is a one space on either side of your vehicle, wear a mask, pop your trunk but stay in your car with the window down. We will have the brief prayer service and the priest will walk from car to car for the blessing of the baskets. Once all have been blessed, you will depart. This idea was inspired by our PTA's 'Trunk or Treat!'

In the news recently have been reports that individual Catholic Bishops and some organizations affiliated with the Catholic Church have said Catholics should not receive the Johnson and Johnson Vaccine as they deemed it morally compromised. There was a similar situation when the Moderna and Pfizer vaccines were released for use.

As Pastor of this community of faith it is my duty to ensure you receive accurate information when it comes to Catholic Teaching.

The Holy See, with Pope Francis explicit permission, has stated through the Covid-19 Committee of the Pontifical Academy for Life, that it is morally acceptable to accept vaccines in good conscience that are effective and clinically safe. This is the judgement of the Magisterium of the Church, it's highest authority.

Today, March 4, to clarify matters a new video was released by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. In the video the chairman of the U.S. bishops' Committee on Doctrine, Bishop Kevin Rhoades, reiterated that use of **the Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 vaccine "can be used in good moral conscience."**


"There's no moral need to turn down a vaccine, including the Johnson & Johnson vaccine, which is morally acceptable to use," Bishop Kevin C. Rhoades of Fort Wayne-South Bend, Indiana, said in a two-minute video posted on YouTube March 4.

The bishop cited an earlier Vatican statement that "has made clear that all the COVID vaccines recognized as clinically safe and effective can be used in good conscience."

Dear parishioners you may legitimately, morally and in good conscience accept any of the three approved vaccines currently being offered, Moderna, Pfizer or Johnson & Johnson. Reception of any of these vaccines is a moral good as it promotes the Common Good.

We must not only be concerned for ourselves but for our neighbors as well. Being vaccinated helps everyone, especially the most vulnerable among us. Please consider getting vaccinated against Covid-19 and know you can do so in good conscience, in doing so you are also performing an act of Charity.

As the pandemic passes the one-year mark and continues to stretch into 2021, a profound side-effect has emerged: isolation.

The experience not only leaves people separated from each other through illness, social distancing and quarantining, but often leaves them, “wondering where God is,” writes Bishop David M. O’Connell, C.M., in his new release: “Behold, I Am with You Always,’ A Pastoral Letter on the Presence of God.”

The title of the letter is taken from the Gospel of Matthew 28:20, which reads, “And behold, I am with you always, until the end of time.” Formally issued Feb. 22, 2021 on the Feast of the Chair of St. Peter, the pastoral letter was published March 1 across diocesan media as a written text and podcast in both English and Spanish. It was also sent to all parishes and schools for distribution in their local communities.

In this, his third pastoral letter as 10th Bishop of Trenton, Bishop O’Connell addresses the painful reality of separation and loneliness, offering guidance to the faithful for developing the assurance of faith and recovering a sense of the presence of God.

The Bishop also remembers those for whom “social distancing has been their way of life for a long time and not by choice: “... The poor, the outcast, the bullied, the marginalized, those living alone, ‘quarantined’ for whatever the reason. Social distance and isolation are sentences imposed by society upon them, without parole. ... We must not forget them.”

Lenten Fast & Abstinence Guidelines: Abstinence from meat on Fridays of Lent (for those 14 and older) is required by Church law. Good Friday is a day of fasting: those between the ages of 18 and 59 should eat less, meaning, take no solid food between meals and only one full meal that day. Serious health conditions excuse a person from these precepts.

Prayer, Fasting, Almsgiving: Lent is above all a time of prayer. To enhance the practice of prayer, St. Aloysius is offering the following opportunities to grow your relationship with Jesus. The Church also invites her members to follow the custom of fasting & to accompany that fasting with an increase of almsgiving for the needs of the poor.
