

Dear Parish Family-

Buona Festa San Giuseppe! Happy Feast of St. Joseph! St. Joseph, the husband of Mary and foster father of Jesus, gets two feast days each year he is so important. Today's feast is a Solemnity of Obligation (aka a 'Holy Day') in Europe but here in the USA, it is a Solemnity (but not of obligation). St. Joseph holds a pride of place and devotion in most Italian families and in Italy it's a Federal Holiday! His other feast day is May 1, the Feast of St. Joseph the Worker. Here in the USA the Solemnity of St. Joseph and the feast of St. Patrick (a minor memorial) occur only days apart but are celebrated quite differently. The whole country becomes Irish on St. Patrick's Day but not Italian on St. Joseph's Day!

My mother, of Italian descent and my father, of Irish descent, would banter about this when we were children. My father's 'proof' that St. Patrick's Day was more important and more highly revered was his yearly one liner, "Well, they paint the line Green on Fifth Avenue on St. Patrick's Day and it *stays* green, they don't paint it purple for the Italians on St. Joseph's Day and you get no parade", he was serious but we thought it funny and I still chuckle to think of it. I have no idea why he chose the color purple, maybe it reminded him of eggplants??? LOL.

Anyway on St. Joseph's Day we ate the wonderful and delicious Sfinge or Zeppole di San Giuseppe which sure beats soda bread hands down, no competition there!!! Keep the green line, I'll take the Sfinge please! LOL. If you have never had Sfinge you're missing out! Simple, sweet and delicious! All Italian bakeries make them for the Festa San Giuseppe. The other custom is to eat "carpenter's pasta" which is spaghetti with breadcrumbs that imitate the saw dust of St. Joseph's workshop. I attended both College and Major Seminary and in both Seminaries the Seminarians of Italian descent would create elaborate St. Joseph "Altars" in the dining room. These were basically like old fashioned wedding cakes, elaborate stepped tiers of cakes, sweets, breads, flowers, candles and deliciousness crowned at the top with a statue of St. Joseph and the entire ceiling of the dining room covered in streamers of red, green and white, the colors of the Italian flag. It was very fun and of course delicious!

The whole world becomes Irish on St. Patrick's Day and the Irish say everyone wants to be Irish on that day but the rest of the year their stomachs want to be Italian and eat Italian! Mangia!

Two great feast days that fall in Lent and give us a little lift and reason to remember La Dolce Vita, life is sweet and life is good; green, purple, cabbage or sfinge...or all of it!






