Dear Parish Family,

The Diocesan Phase of the World Wide Synod of Bishop's closes in the Diocese of Trenton on April 1, 2022. I want to thank all those who chose to participate in the Synod Listening Sessions held in the parish.

Bishop O'Connell shared with the priests that of the 97 parishes in the Diocese only 35 parishes had participated in the Synod process as of March 17. The Diocesan Committee received 383 group responses that represented 2,100 participants. That averages to 60 participants per parish. Our parish was one of the few parishes that had multiple sessions on different times and days for the last 3 months.

As the pastor, I frequently wrote about the Synod beginning in the Fall of 2021 and continuing until now. On several occasions I squeezed it into my homilies and we even set aside a time for our daily Mass goers to participate. Our parish responded to Pope Francis' appeal to listen and convey your thoughts to him through the Synod process. The success of the Synod Process at the parish level can be credited to the great Synod Team of lay people who attended the orientation meetings, training meetings, and support meetings the Diocese offered. They also blocked out time from their personal schedules to be available as Facilitators and Note Takers. I am especially grateful to them for the massive effort they dedicated to Pope Francis invitation.

The Process of the Listening Sessions has produced good information for the Holy Father, our Bishop and our parish. If you would like to contribute there are still live sessions available until March 30.

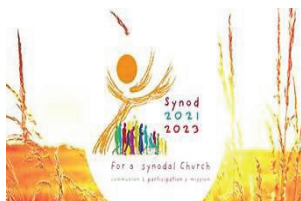
