This Sunday is the 4th Sunday of Lent, also called Laetare Sunday. The penitential color moves from violet to rose, music is more uplifting, and flowers are permitted for the Altar, all of this signifying the lightening of the penitential practices at the mid-point of Lent, encouraging us to look toward the Resurrection at Easter now just a few short weeks ahead of us. The name “Laetare” (meaning Rejoice) is taken from the first word of the Latin Introit for the Mass from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah 66:10-11, “Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exalt and be satisfied at her consoling breast.”

In the Catholic Church, the anointing of the sick is a sacrament that is administered to a Catholic "who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age". There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. The Sacrament may be received at any time during a person's illness, especially before surgery or treatment. We suggest calling to receive the Sacrament *before* a person is in grave danger of death as it is not always possible to have a priest available at the actual time of death. If you would like to schedule the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for a loved one, please contact the parish office.




