Dear Parish Family,

Alleluia, Alleluia, CHRIST IS RISEN!!! Alleluia, Alleluia, Indeed He is Risen! Alleluia, Alleluia!!!

During the last few weeks of Lent, I have shared with you several articles from the Vatican

News Service taken from Sr. Christine Schenk's scholarly book on women and authority in the early Church.

After the Virgin Mary, the next most important woman of the early Church was Mary of Magdala. We know from the Gospels that she was a very wealthy woman from whom Jesus had driven out seven demons. Ever grateful, she committed herself, her fortune, and her household to Jesus. Her wealth was so great that the Gospels tell us she not only supported Jesus out of her own means, but also all twelve of the Apostles! Now that is gratitude of the heart!!

It is no wonder then, that on the first Easter Day, she is given the gift of being the first witness of the Resurrection. She had stayed with the Virgin Mary, St. John, and Jesus on Good Friday, assisted with the burial, and was returning to finish the Jewish Ritual for burial on the third day, when she encountered the Risen Lord at the empty tomb. He sends her to the Apostles to announce He is Risen. Thus, she earned the title, "The Apostle to the Apostles".

She is also credited with being the 'inventor' of the Easter egg. She is the reason we celebrate Easter with eggs and egg products; egg based breads, pastries, pie's etc. Many years ago, the Italian cook in one of my assignments would make Easter Bread baskets for my niece and nephew, the basket had a cross that held a decorated hardboiled egg to the egg based breadbasket.

There are two legends associated with eggs and Mary of Magdala. One says that she packed a basket of hard-boiled eggs before leaving for Jesus' tomb as a snack to share with the other women who were to meet her at there. When she arrived at the tomb, and met the Risen Lord, her eggs turned the colors of the rainbow (in some stories they just turned red) as a sign of joy. The other legend says she traveled to Rome to meet the Emperor; when meeting the Emperor one had to bring a gift. Mary brought a white hardboiled egg proclaiming to him the Resurrection. As she handed him the egg, the Emperor said, "Someone could no more rise from the dead than an egg can turn red, and suddenly the egg she handed him turned blood red. The story says she chastised the Emperor for the shedding of Jesus' blood by Pontius Pilate; the Emperor then had Pontius Pilate removed as prefect of Jerusalem for his cruelty based on her testimony.

Eggs have traditionally been a sign of new life. The hardness of the shell represents the hard rock of the tomb. The new chick springs forth to life just as Jesus broke the sealed rock of the tomb and rose to new life.

We can thank Mary of Magdala, Jesus' first female disciple and the first witness of the Resurrection, for the custom of celebrating with eggs and egg based products on Easter Day. This great woman evangelizer and teacher of the early Church, a woman of authority, who inspired many other women to go forth into what was truly "a man's world" of the first century, and boldly proclaim Jesus is Risen and Jesus is Lord!




In the Catholic Church, the anointing of the sick is a sacrament that is administered to a Catholic "who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age". There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. The Sacrament may be received at any time during a person's illness, especially before surgery or treatment. We suggest calling to receive the Sacrament *before* a person is in grave danger of death as it is not always possible to have a priest available at the actual time of

death. If you would like to schedule the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for a loved one, please contact the parish office.

WHY REGISTER?

Every Catholic should be registered in a parish. Beside the active support and involvement that the registra-

tion enables, it provides a sense of belonging and identity in a parish community. In times of joy and in times of struggle, it is comforting to have the support of a faith family. There are many reasons to register:

- + Parish registration is a mandatory condition for many sacraments including Baptism and Matrimony. It is therefore important to register if you are a Jackson resident as soon as you start worshiping here. You are not automatically registered if you received sacraments here as a child, were married here or went to the school.
- + You may request verification letters to sponsor individuals for sacraments, receive sacraments yourself or your child (i.e. marriage, baptism).
- + You will receive end-of-the-year tax contribution statements if you use online giving, envelopes, checks or another identifier of contributions. Unfortunately, we can not issue statements if you 'throw cash in the basket'.
- + The Diocese will know that our parish has a healthy base of registered, supportive parishioners.
- + For Religious Education and sacramental preparation.; families of those attending must be registered.


Prayer to St. Michael


