Dear Parish Family-

Last week's bulletin message alerted you to the reasons for the temporary closure of Gonzaga Hall for safety reasons until a new lighting system can be installed due to a light fixture falling during the re-roofing of the building.

Speaking of roofs, by the time this is published I am hopeful work will have begun on the C Wing roof of the old school building, currently being leased to the Alpha School, which should take 3 weeks weather permitting. After the C Wing has been re-roofed then the D Wing roof work will begin and require 3 weeks of work, weather permitting.

When the roof project begins on the C and D Wings the great parking lot panalopy will no doubt begin again, what fun! The lot behind Morello Hall (the old school cafeteria) will be closed for the duration of the project some two months. And yes, another port-a-potty will arrive to cause a new stink – remember they are required by law so grin and bear it! For all the complainers gearing up for battle...there is a sign outside my office that says, "Complaint Department, please take a number", all you need do is pull the pin of a grenade to get your number! Kaboom! Have a nice day!

The old Cafeteria has been re-named "Morello Hall". St. Aloysius School closed 5 years ago and it has not been used as a Cafeteria since that time, it is time to move on. It has been used as one of several parish halls for the last 5 years and it is time to make the transition official-- from hence forth it will be now called "Morello Hall", named as a fitting memorial to the founding pastor who built it as a parish hall. It was built as a parish hall in the 1960's and when Msgr. Morello founded the School in the 1980's it was converted to a Cafeteria for the newly opened school. So in a sense it is reverting to its original intended use, a parish hall. We will eventually put up a sign and the bust of Msgr. Morello will be moved into that space. During the 6+ weeks of work the B Wing, currently used for parish functions, will be used by the Alpha School. After what happened in Gonzaga Hall it was prudent to have a plan for the school during re-roofing. The other consideration was the noise during the project. For those groups that use the B wing for meetings and activities all events will be moved to Morello Hall (old school cafeteria) during the length of the project which is about two months give or take a week or two.

Happy Palm Sunday and may the coming Holy Week be one of blessing and spiritual renewal for you as together we relive the passion and Resurrection of our Sweet Lord Jesus!


Baptism and Confirmation Sponsors:

It is a great honor to be asked to be a god-parent for Baptism or a sponsor for the Sacrament of Confirmation. With this honor comes responsibility, as well. The Code of Canon Law stipulates that sponsors and godparents must be fully initiated and should be actively practicing their faith. If they are married, their marriage must be recognized by the Catholic Church. For St. Aloysius Church to issue a sponsor certificate, we ask that you be registered with the parish for a minimum of three months and regular in attendance and support of the parish. If you are not known personally to the priests, deacons or staff, and are not using weekly collection envelopes or online giving, it is often difficult for us to issue a sponsor certificate. If you are unsure if you are actively registered, please call the parish office.


