Dear Parish Family,

Many thanks to everyone involved in any way with Pope Francis' call to participate in the Synod process! If you have not participated and wish to, there is still the opportunity, until April 10, to complete an online survey which will be included in the packet sent to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops and then on to Rome for the Worldwide Synod of Bishops in 2023. Beginning on Sunday May 8, 2022, we will be adding a 12 noon Mass said according to the Rite of St. Pope Paul VI, strictly following the traditional rubrics of the Mass. This is a project of Fr. Jim Smith our Parochial Vicar and he will be the Presider for these Masses. The Mass will exclusively use English for the Mass Prayers and parts, the priest and the people will all face in the same direction during the Canon of the Mass (Ad Orientum), there will be some Gregorian Chant that could involve the use of Latin, incense, exclusive use of the First Canon of the Mass (Eucharistic Prayer) and several other traditional elements. All of these elements are permitted; some are preferred, in Vatican II's Document on the Liturgy Sacrosanctum Concilium. Fr. Jim Smith will be writing more about this new Mass in future bulletins.

If you are opposed to tradition or have some other hang up about these things, here is my advice in advance; go to one of the other 4 Masses offered! Please do not write me letters or send me e-mails that the Mass is too long, uses Latin Gregorian Chant and incense. Simply avoid that Mass and you can avoid being upset and I can avoid hearing about it! LOL

If you love all the traditional elements, having read, understood and agree with Vatican II's Sacrosanctum Concilium, please, by all means, attend this Mass, but no need to write me about your joy.

Next weekend is Palm Sunday. Since we had to order Palm in January before the Pandemic restrictions were lifted, we may have under ordered so please consider just taking one frond of palm per person before Mass; whatever is left on the table after that Mass may be taken.

Thank you to all those who took part in the Consecration of Russia and Ukraine last Friday whether in person here, via Livestream, at another parish or on your own! Let us continue to pray for peace in Ukraine and to assist in the humanitarian needs of these unjustly persecuted people. Slava Ukraini! Glory to Ukraine!

Traditional High Mass in English with a Little Catechesis by Fr. Jim

Traditional High Mass in English. Did I get your attention in last week's bulletin? Does the idea of attending a traditional High Mass in English pique your curiosity? Allow me to provide some context. Why the distinction for "Traditional" or "High Mass"?

As Catholics, we adhere closely to Scripture and Tradition. In fact, the Scriptures (especially the New Testament) were born out of the Tradition of the early Christian Church. Just as we have our own family traditions of different foods we like to prepare for certain occasions, so too does the Church have its Tradition that has been handed on from the very beginning.

One of the traditions of the Mass has been for the priest to face the altar with the congregation. In the Mass, the Priest serves *in persona Christi*—in the person of Christ—and in this role he is recreating the sacrifice of Calvary. He is interceding for the people with God, and it is only natural that he should face the same direction as the people: toward God, to whom our prayers are addressed.

This May, we will make a return to tradition by celebrating a traditional High Mass in English at its own time on Sundays. Stay tuned for more teachings on the Church's tradition.




