Dear Parish Family-

“Hidden first in a womb of flesh, he sanctified human birth by his own birth; hidden afterward in the womb of the earth, he gave life to the dead by his resurrection...This day brings a message of joy; it is the day of the Lord’s resurrection.” From a homily given on Easter Sunday 412 A.D. by the priest monk of Jerusalem Hesychius of Jerusalem.

Happy Easter to all of you from myself, Fr. Jim, Fr. Jim and Msgr. Joe, our deacons and our staff.

This most solemn and Holiest of Holy Days, the Church’s greatest festival, Easter, brings Christian hearts not only joy but hope.

There has been some chatter since the New Year about the possible transfer of Fr. Jim Smith, our Parochial Vicar. A Parochial Vicar generally serves a term of 3 years and then transferred to a new assignment. Due to the Covid-19 pandemic only necessary transfers have occurred; however, this year the Bishop announced to the priests he would be transferring all those whose terms ended during Covid-19. This includes our Fr. Jim Smith who will be transferred to a new assignment on July 1. The announcement of all transfers will be made by the Bishop on May 1 on the Diocesan Website. We had the privilege of having Fr. Jim Smith with us for an extra year and for that we are grateful. I know he will be missed by many and was a good priest for our parish. He had a good four years here and you were generous in your hospitality and kindness toward a newly ordained priest, which is very important for their success. A priest who has a good experience in his first assignment carries that with him throughout his priesthood; it brings him joy and comfort in the harsher moments of life. A priest never forgets his first assignment. Thank you to everyone who made Fr. Jim’s first priestly assignment a good one! Please join me in wishing him well in whatever assignment the Bishop has in mind for him! This news is most probably poignant for many but should also be one of joy. Our faith teaches us to die and rise with Christ at every moment of the Pilgrim journey. Every ending also has a new beginning. I have been told we will be receiving another Parochial Vicar which will also be announced on May 1.

A week ago I arrived back from a Pilgrimage in the footsteps of St. Paul in Greece and Turkey. Just before leaving a couple who had been on a footsteps of St. Paul pilgrimage many years ago told me that when you hear the letters of St. Paul read in the places he sent them you never forget it, when you hear them at Mass in your own Church you hear them in a more profound way. Indeed!

On March 16 & 17 preliminary work was done in preparation for re-roofing of the C and D wings of the old school, now occupied by Alpha School. The old roof was an aggregate roof, meaning it was covered in stone. An industrial vacuum was used to remove all the stone. The re-roofing was scheduled to start the latter part of the week of March 22 and will take 6 weeks, weather permitting. The Alpha School will occupy the B wing during the re-roofing so all parish meetings will be moved to Morello Hall (old school cafeteria). Gonzaga Hall is currently closed due to a safety issue surrounding the lighting which is in the process of being resolved by changing out the light fixtures and affixing new lighting to the structural members of the building. The small parking lot off Bates Road will be closed during re-roofing as it is needed as a staging area for the equipment and supplies. Your patience is appreciated.

Happy Easter and may the Joy of Christ’s Resurrection fill your hearts with the joy and light of His Divinity, May it reflect brightly from your soul!

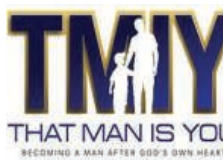

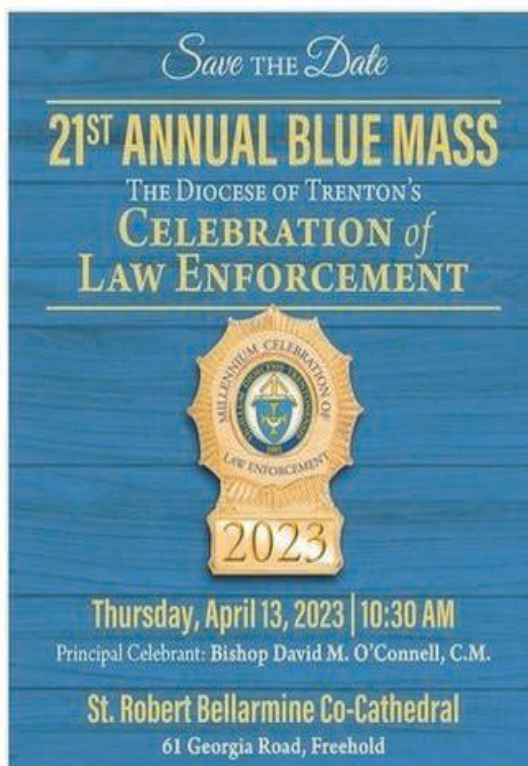

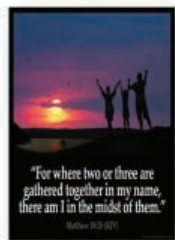
Baptism and Confirmation Sponsors:

It is a great honor to be asked to be a godparent for Baptism or a sponsor for the Sacrament of Confirmation. With this honor comes responsibility, as well. The Code of Canon Law stipulates that sponsors and godparents must be fully initiated and should be actively practicing their faith. If they are married, their marriage must be recognized by the Catholic Church. For St. Aloysius Church to issue a sponsor certificate, we ask that you be registered with the parish for a minimum of three months and regular in attendance and support of the parish. If you are not known personally to the priests, deacons or staff, and are not using weekly collection envelopes or online giving, it is often difficult for us to issue a sponsor certificate. If you are unsure if you are actively registered, please call the parish office.

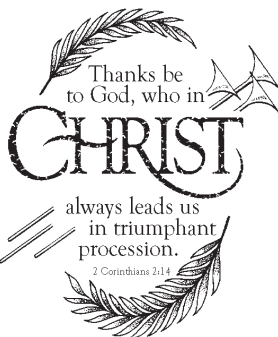
