Dear Parish Family,

Today is the second Sunday after Easter, also called Divine Mercy Sunday. The devotion to God's Divine Mercy came to wider attention in modern times through Sr. Maria Faustina Kowalska, a Polish nun and saint. She was born Helen Kowalska near Lodz, Poland, in 1905.

By age 20, she joined the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of the Most Blessed Sacrament in Warsaw. From 1931 until her death in 1938, she experienced visions of Jesus and wrote about them in her diary, making around 1,800 entries! During these years, the world was facing great turmoil. The National Socialists, or Nazi Party, were gaining power in Germany, passing anti-Jewish laws known as the Nuremberg Laws, and opening the first concentration camps. In Italy, Mussolini and fascism were on the rise. These two powers would later join with Imperial Japan to threaten the world.

In her diary, St. Faustina wrote that Jesus asked for a feast in honor of Divine Mercy on the first Sunday after Easter. He said, "My daughter, tell the whole world about my inconceivable mercy. I desire that the feast of mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially poor sinners. On that day, the very depths of my tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of my mercy. The soul that will go to confession and receive holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. ... My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter" (Diary, No. 699).

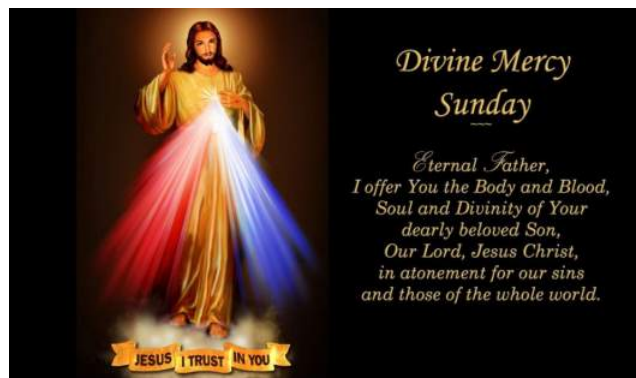
This became a reality on April 30, 2000, when St. Faustina was the first person canonized in the new millennium. Pope St. John Paul II (r. 1978-2005) not only elevated her a saint, but also announced during his canonization homily, that "from now on throughout the church (the second Sunday of Easter) will be called Divine Mercy Sunday."

On Divine Mercy Sunday, we pray the beautiful words Jesus gave to Faustina: "Eternal Father, I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world." We also say, "For the sake of his sorrowful passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world. Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world" (Diary, No. 476).

People usually pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet at 3 p.m., known as the hour of Mercy, on Fridays, but it can be said at any time. In the image of Divine Mercy, two rays shine from Jesus' Sacred Heart, along with the words, "Jesus, I trust in you".

Our world faces many troubles, including conflicts, wars, and power struggles, much as in Faustina's time. Let us turn to Divine Mercy and trust in Him who is Mercy itself.

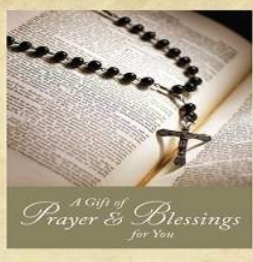

Anointing of the Sick is a sacrament of comfort and hope, not only for those nearing the end of life, but also for the chronically ill and elderly who are in fragile health. Children facing serious illness or major surgery may also receive this sacrament. It can be given more than once, especially if someone recovers and then becomes ill again, or if their condition worsens. If you or a loved one would benefit from anointing, please contact the parish office. ***Do not wait until the final moments—family members and caregivers are encouraged to seek this support early, so the Church can offer strength and care when it is most needed.***



Sacrament of MATRIMONY - We welcome and congratulate all who are seeking the Sacrament of Matrimony. Church arrangements and marriage preparation should be made one year in advance for those who are registered with the parish and living in Jackson. Call the parish office as soon as possible at 732-370-0500 ext. 204. If you are making plans for a “destination wedding,” please call the parish office first. There is a way to receive the Sacrament of Matrimony before your destination wedding.

MARRIAGE CONVALIDATION - The Convalidation of a Marriage is a special wedding ceremony by which one’s marriage is recognized and blessed by the Catholic Church. Through this process your marriage will be fully embraced by the Church, granting it all the spiritual blessings and benefits it offers. If you are interested in learning more about a Marriage Convalidation contact the parish office.



To begin the process of scheduling a date for Baptism, families are asked to be registered in the parish. Parents and Godparents are required to attend a Baptism Prep Class, and Godparents will need to provide a Letter of Eligibility from their current parish (where they reside). Baptisms are held most Sundays at 12:00pm, following the 10:30am Mass. 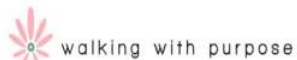

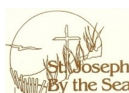
