

Dear Parish Family,

Just before Holy Week, I led a pilgrimage to Egypt where patriarchs, Abraham, Jacob, and Joseph went along with the I2 tribes of Israel. Moses, of course, was a Prince of Egypt before leading the tribes of Israel to the Promised Land, and Jeremiah, the prophet preached there. Jesus, Mary and Joseph lived there for 4 or 5 years after fleeing Herod to fulfill the prophecy, "I have called my Son out of Egypt."

Near the end of the pilgrimage, we stopped at a papyrus shop run by a Christian family. Papyrus is a plant that changed the world. Prior to the Egyptians unlocking the secret of papyrus, all written language was either on clay or stone. With the invention of papyrus scrolls, communication became easier; it was, in a sense, the "computer" of its time. The earliest scriptures were all written on papyrus and were nearly indestructible; it could be rolled and carried easily over long distances. It was the first 'paper' but, technically not paper at all, since it is a fibrous plant material made from the inner part of the papyrus plant. The outer hull was used for basket making. Moses was floated down the river in a papyrus basket.

The papyrus shop we stopped at specialized in paintings on papyrus of various subjects and texts. One could even buy plain papyrus for personal use. While admiring the many paintings, someone asked me if I had a choice to take any picture, which one would I choose. Well, there were so many and they were all beautiful. I said, I would not choose any for myself as I do not need one, but noted that the Last Supper would look beautiful in the Church over the Altar of Repose, especially since we are in the final year of the Eucharistic Revival. Before I knew it, the Pilgrims decided to all chip in and buy this huge painting for the Church (40 inches by 80 inches), and an interpretation of Leonardo da Vinci's Last Supper. Now, this is interesting, but did not factor in the purchase, the Egyptian artist under paints his images with a hidden image using phosphorescent paint. During the day, you see a vivid colorful image of the Supper of the Lord, but in total darkness, that image recedes and three images appear. On the viewers left, the 3rd fall on the way of the Cross; in the center, the crucifixion with Mary and John; and, on the right, the Resurrection--all glowing green. So, if you happen to see it at night, it's not a miracle, its art and science combined!

The big challenge was framing a huge image on papyrus. The shop recommended it be sandwiched between two layers of Plexiglas, without any matt or frame, so the viewers could see the papyrus edges. The painting is super light in weight since it is on papyrus, but the frame is very heavy, requiring 6 men to carry it. Last Saturday, the parish Men's Group came to the rescue and hung the painting, no easy matter. It required braided steel cable, concrete anchors, and lifting it over our heads. Yikes! The lifting was a miracle, not the glowing image under the painting! Many thanks to the Men's Group for spending 4 hours on their Saturday to help out and get it up in time for Divine Mercy Sunday. Many thanks to the 2024 Egypt Pilgrims who came together to add a thing of beauty to the Church that ever draws our attention to the Divine Institution of the Most Holy Eucharist!

I was touched by the Pilgrim's decision to bring something back from their Pilgrimage to share with the wider community. It reminded me of a Church in Rome where, in the 4th Century, a parishioner went to the Holy Land and, was so inspired, she came back and had a mosaic placed in the Church of the city of Jerusalem so that all of her fellow parishioners could symbolically make the pilgrimage to the Holy Land. Well, now each of you can symbolically make a pilgrimage to Egypt when you contemplate this image painted on Egyptian papy-rus! The only place in the entire Bible where God calls a land "Holy" is Egypt. Found in the Book of Exodus when God commands Moses to remove his sandals because he is standing on "Holy Ground". While you may not be able to stand on the soil of Egypt, you can gaze upon the image painted on the Egyptian papyrus from a plant that grew on "Holy Ground"!

In the Catholic Church, the anointing of the sick is a sacrament that is administered to a Catholic "who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age". There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. The Sacrament may be received at any time during a person's illness, especially before surgery or treatment. We suggest calling to receive the Sacrament *before* a person is in grave danger of death as it is not always possible to have a priest available at the actual time of

death. If you would like to schedule the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for a loved one, please contact the parish office.
