Dear Parish Family,

Christ is Risen! Indeed He is Risen! Easter is the ultimate reason for our hope. Hope is one of the three Theological Virtues St. Paul tells us are eternal. St. Paul reminds us that when we die we can only take three things with us; faith, hope and love. Only these can pierce the veil between this world and the next. It is these three virtues that we are able to carry with us to the throne of God's Grace, it is these three we will need to survive and pass the Just Judge, Christ the Lord. This Easter occurs during the Holy Year of Hope. So hope is already the focus of the year we are living through. Of the three Cardinal Virtues, hope is probably the most difficult to understand.



Hope, we can say, was born in the very first encounter between humanity and God. When God called Abram and gave him a new name, Abraham, he made a covenant with him, and promised he would have descendants more numerous than the stars of the sky and the sands of the seashore. The Book of the Hebrews tells us at that moment "Abraham hoped against hope." St. Paul states in his letter to the Romans, "He believed, hoping against hope, that he would become 'the father of many nations,' according to what was said, 'Thus shall your descendants be'". When God made this promise, Abraham was 99 years old, and his wife, who had been barren all her life, was 90 years old. Yet, he hoped against hope, and his hope was fulfilled in the birth of his son, Isaac, one year later. From this moment of hope to the Angel's appearance to Virgin Mary, who also had to hope against hope to accept the words of the Angel as she was a Virgin, unmarried (but betrothed), had to wonder what the Angel's greeting might mean. She too, hoped against hope, and her hope was fulfilled, along with ours, in the birth of the Son of God. For this reason, St. Pope John Paul II called Mary the Mother of Hope, thus Mary is "the Mother of hope for the community of believers and for individual Christians, she encourages and guides Her children as they await the kingdom, supporting them in their daily trials throughout the events of history, however tragic."

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us, "Hope is the theological virtue by which we desire the kingdom of heaven and eternal life as our happiness, placing our trust in Christ's promises and relying not on our own strength, but on the help of the grace of the Holy Spirit." (CCC 1817), and this "takes up the hopes that inspire men's activities and purifies them so as to order them to the Kingdom of heaven; it keeps man from discouragement; it sustains him during times of abandonment; it opens up his heart in expectation of eternal beatitude. Buoyed up by hope, he is preserved from selfishness and led to the happiness that flows from charity." (CCC 1818) In these passages, we see the three virtues linked together. God has placed in each of our hearts the desire and longing for true happiness. The virtue of hope responds to this innermost desire and helps us to place our trust in God.

Easter is a season of hope, reminding us not to place our hope in earthly things, but in eternal things, for hope is always a gift of the Holy Spirit helping us envision what still cannot be seen and which would otherwise be impossible to expect. Hope is not the same as optimism; it is not based on human assurances, but on the promise and word of God. It calls us to accept what is difficult for us to understand in God's plans. True hope does not disappoint. Let us ask the Lord to strengthen our hope in times of darkness, and to help us to be a source of hope for others.

I offer to our immigrant brothers and sisters, regardless of their legal standing, at a difficult crossroad, some hope for a good future. Trust in Jesus our hope! You are loved and cared for, you have dignity and rights, do not let anyone put you down or make you a slave to fear. Live in the freedom of the children of God, and give glory to God in all you do!

In the Catholic Church, the anointing of the sick is a sacrament that is administered to a Catholic "who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age". There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. The Sacrament may be received at any time during a person's illness, especially before surgery or treatment. We suggest calling to receive the Sacrament *before* a person is in grave danger of death as it is not always possible to have a priest available at the actual time of death. If you would like to schedule the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for a loved one, please contact the parish office.






