Dear Parish Family,

Friday was May 1, which is known as Labor Day or Workers' Day in Europe. This day actually began in the United States in the 19th century, after the Haymarket riots in Chicago, when workers called for an eight-hour workday. The idea later spread to Europe, where the Socialist Party promoted the same cause. Here in the United States, we don't celebrate May 1 as Labor Day because we have our own Labor Day on September 1, which is separate from those Socialist ideas.



In 1955, Pope Pius XII made May 1 the feast of St. Joseph the Worker. He wanted to connect this day with the Christian idea of work rather than the Socialist view. So, in Catholic countries, people celebrate the Feast of St. Joseph the Worker on May 1, honoring those who work under his guidance and inspiration.

St. Joseph has long been connected with hard work and labor. While we often call him a carpenter, the word in the Bible can also mean laborer, mason, bricklayer, builder, or anyone who works with their hands. When I was a child, I remember most images of St. Joseph showed him holding a builder's square or a woodworker's plane. For many years, I kept an old wood plane on my desk as a symbol of St. Joseph, until I received a statue of him. People often asked about the plane, which gave me a chance to talk about St. Joseph.

Scripture tells us that St. Joseph worked to support his family and taught those skills to Jesus. In the hymn *"Lord of all Hopefulness,"* the second verse says, *"Lord of all eagerness, Lord of all faith, whose strong hands were skilled at the plane and the lathe: Be there at our labors, and give us, we pray, your strength in our hearts, Lord, at the noon of the day."* This hymn shows how manual work and spiritual faith go hand in hand.

Saint Josemaria Escriva, from Spain, strongly believed that work and prayer are connected. He taught that we make our work holy by doing it well, offering it to God, and using it to help others. This means even our daily tasks can become acts of love and prayer. St. Josemaria said, *"We are under the obligation to work, and to work conscientiously, with a sense of responsibility, with love and perseverance, without shirking or frivolity. Because work is a command from God, and God is to be obeyed, as the Psalmist says, in laetitia, joyfully!"* and *"You have to work with such supernatural vision that you let yourself be absorbed only in order to make it divine. In this way, the earthly becomes divine, the temporal eternal."*

May St. Joseph watch over, support, protect, and encourage everyone who works for their families, for God, and for the Church. May we all offer even our most routine and tedious work to God as a prayer, so that it helps make us holy.

Sacrament of MATRIMONY - We welcome and congratulate all who are seeking the Sacrament of Matrimony. Church arrangements and marriage preparation should be made one year in advance for those who are registered with the parish and living in Jackson. Call the parish office as soon as possible at 732-370-0500 ext. 204. If you are making plans for a "destination wedding," please call the parish office first. There is a way to receive the Sacrament of Matrimony before your destination wedding.

MARRIAGE CONVALIDATION - The Convalidation of a Marriage is a special wedding ceremony by which one's marriage is recognized and blessed by the Catholic Church. Through this process your marriage will be fully embraced by the Church, granting it all the spiritual blessings and benefits it offers. No Baptism date can be secured until all requirements are met.

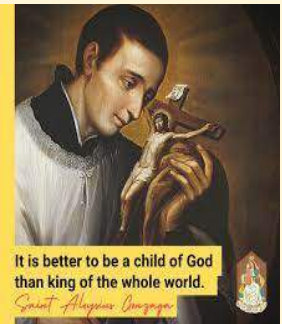
