Dear Parish Family,

Today concludes the Novendailes, the nine-day period of official mourning and prayers of suffrage for the soul of Pope Francis. Tomorrow, we will begin prayers for the selection of St. Peter's successor, the Vicar of Christ on earth.

Jesus entrusted to St. Peter and his successors, the keys to heaven and earth. Often represented by a silver key and gold key, these keys can be seen in images of St. Peter the Apostle and on the Coat of Arms of the Vatican and the Popes.

The media would have you believe the Cardinals will be picking the successor of Pope Francis, nonsense. The Church always seeks a successor to St. Peter, the first called and the prince of the Apostles. The popes are often simply referred to as "Peter" regardless of what name they may have chosen. In the early days of Christianity, they were referred to as the Vicar of Peter who was the Vicar of Christ; eventually the popes were just called the Vicar of Christ.

While we think of the cardinals during the election, indeed they and they alone cast ballots, but in truth the whole Church takes part in the conclave, each having their part to play. We pray for the cardinals daily that they follow the movement of the Holy Spirit to choose a worthy and holy bishop for the Diocese of Rome and Universal Pastor of the Church. We pray the man will have the heart of a shepherd or as Pope Francis liked to say, "the smell of the sheep" about him.

Who that man is, is not all that important. I know folks get all worked up about the Pope, for or against. For most of Christian history, the average Catholic, including the clergy, could not even tell you the pope's name and, if they did know his name, they knew nothing else about him. That is as it should be! Faith is firmly rooted in Christ, the Pope is His Vicar. A vicar speaks and acts on behalf of one of higher authority than themselves and exercises their authority in the portion allotted by the one above them.

The Romans, as our Bishop has noted, have a saying, "Fat Pope, Skinny Pope" simply meaning they are different from one another. Each brings his God-given talents to bear in guiding the Barq (boat) of the Church until the Lord returns in glory. When the Lord returns there will be no popes, He will take back what He has given, and will reign gloriously forever.

So that brings me to another Roman saying (the Romans have many funny and pithy sayings), when a pope is sick or dying they say, "Don't worry, they will make another one." Christ does not leave the Church unattended!

Pope Francis was a good pope, may we be blessed with another good pope but more importantly a holy pope. Who cares if he is charismatic (though a bonus media-wise), or if he is funny, or tall, or articulate, or good with finance, or smiles, or is grim; what we need is a *holy* pope. The Romans say we should always show the "bella faccia" or good face. Sometimes the "bella faccia" is a fake face. The popes must always show their true face. Francis was a pope who showed a true face, he was very real and down to earth. May he rest in peace and may we have gratitude for what he taught us. But let us not expect the new man to be the old man, only to hope he is his own man, and a holy man.





Then, we can be sure we get a pope we do not deserve but receive, as the Senior Cardinal Deacon will say, "Gaudium Magnum", with the greatest of joy!

In the Catholic Church, the anointing of the sick is a sacrament that is administered to a Catholic "who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age". There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. The Sacrament may be received at any time during a person's illness, especially before surgery or treatment. We suggest calling to receive the Sacrament *before* a person is in grave danger of death as it is not always possible to have a priest available at the actual time of death. If you would like to schedule the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for a loved one, please contact the parish office.




