Dear Parish Family,

On October 25, 2016 the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith, directed by Pope Francis, reaffirmed the Noble and Ancient Christian Tradition of burying human remains in a Cemetery following a Funeral Mass. The Congregation urged pastors to ensure that the body be present for the Funeral Mass even when the deceased specifically asked for Cremation. The Body should always come to Church first and then, if chosen, be cremated and following Cremation be interred or inurned in a Cemetery. It explicitly forbids placing cremated remains on the mantle, bookshelf, etc. It also prohibits cremated remains from being separated into smaller vessels, made into amulets, jewelry, shot out of guns or canons or dispersed to the winds. I wrote about this at the time.

I am once again providing a summary of that Document from 2016 entitled <u>Ad Resurgendum Cum</u> Christo, To Rise with Christ:

- Following the most ancient Christian tradition, the Church insistently recommends that the bodies of the deceased be buried in cemeteries or other sacred places.
- Burial is above all the most fitting way to express faith and hope in the resurrection of the body.
- By burying the bodies of the faithful, the Church confirms her faith in the resurrection of the body, and intends to show the great dignity of the human body.
- Burial in a cemetery or another sacred place adequately corresponds to the piety and respect owed to the bodies of the faithful departed who through Baptism have become temples of the Holy Spirit.
- The burial of the faithful departed in cemeteries or other sacred places encourages family members and the whole Christian community to pray for and remember the dead.
- Through the practice of burying the dead in cemeteries, in churches or their environs, Christian tradition has upheld the relationship between the living and the dead and has opposed any tendency to minimize, or relegate to the purely private sphere, the event of death and the meaning it has for Christians.
- In circumstances when cremation is chosen because of sanitary, economic or social considerations, this choice must never violate the explicitly-stated or the reasonably inferable wishes of the deceased faithful
- The Church raises no doctrinal objections to this practice, since cremation of the deceased's body does not affect his or her soul.
- Thus cremation, in and of itself, objectively negates neither the Christian doctrine of the soul's immortality nor that of the resurrection of the body.
- The Church continues to prefer the practice of burying the bodies of the deceased, because this shows a greater esteem towards the deceased.
- Cremation is not opposed per se to the Christian religion under the condition that this choice has not been made through "a denial of Christian dogmas, the animosity of a secret society, or hatred of the Catholic religion and the Church".

In the absence of motives contrary to Christian doctrine, the Church, **after the celebration of the funeral rite**, accompanies the choice of cremation, providing the relevant liturgical and pastoral directives.

- When, for legitimate motives, cremation of the body has been chosen, the ashes of the faithful must be laid to rest in a sacred place, that is, in a cemetery or, in certain cases, in a church or an area, which has been set aside for this purpose, and so dedicated by the competent ecclesial authority.
- From the earliest times, Christians have desired that the faithful departed become the objects of the Christian community's prayers and remembrance.
- The reservation of the ashes of the departed in a sacred place ensures that they are not excluded from the prayers and remembrance of their family or the Christian community.
- The conservation of the ashes of the departed in a domestic residence is not permitted.
- It is not permitted to scatter the ashes of the faithful departed in the air, on land, at sea or in some other way, nor may they be preserved in mementos, pieces of jewelry or other objects.

When the deceased notoriously has requested cremation and the scattering of their ashes for reasons contrary to the Christian faith, a Christian funeral must be denied to that person according to the norms of the law.

Last week we received from the Apostolic Nuncio in Washington a further clarification in the form of a letter sent by Cardinal Luis Ladaria, Prefect of the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith concerning new developing methods of disposing of human remains that are contrary to Christian Doctrine and also reaffirming the 2016 instruction Ad Resurgendum Cum Christo.

Cardinal Ladaria wrote; "In accordance with civil laws, new techniques for treating the bodies of the deceased as alternative practices to cremation, presented as preferable because they are more ecological, are spreading more and more often in Western countries.

These techniques aim to dispose of the bodies of the deceased in a way that is presumed to be rapid and hygienically safe, as well as respectful of the environment, since the residues of the treatment would be released into nature, with the intent of fertilizing the soil. However, this practice implies an approach which, in fact, tends to eliminate any trace of a sense of the sacred and of effective pity for the mortal remains of the deceased."

He gives five points of instruction regarding the disposition of human remains"

1. The Church insistently recommends the burial of the bodies of the dead, as noted in n. 3 of the instruction Ad resurgendum cum Christo, published on 25 October 2016.

- 2. Cremation, chosen for reasons not contrary to Christian doctrine, is not forbidden, but the ashes of the dead must "be kept in a sacred place", for the reasons referred to in the aforementioned Instruction (cf. nn. 4 and 5).
- 3. "To avoid any kind of pantheist, naturalist or nihilist misunderstanding, the dispersion of the ashes in the air, on earth or in water or in any other way is not permitted" (n. 7).

- 4. In the cases of new techniques for treating corpses, the same criteria mentioned above are to be applied: what remains after the treatment of corpses must be "kept in a sacred place" intended for burial and not simply in a place blessed by the clergy.
- 5. Furthermore, if, in the implementation of a new technique for treating corpses there was nothing left [of the body], such a practice would not be acceptable from the point of view of Catholic doctrine.

To face the spread of such unacceptable practices, the Pastors of the Church of this Bishops' Conference are called to explain to the faithful the incompatibility of these practices with the teaching of the Catholic Church. At the same time, it is good that they reaffirm this teaching with special reference to the immortality of the soul, the resurrection of the soul, the respect due to the bodies of the faithful departed and the communion between the living and the dead, rejecting any materialistic, naturalistic approach, pantheistic and nihilistic that often underlies these techniques of treating corpses.

His Eminence asked that these principals of Christian Doctrine be widely publicized to the Christian Faithful. With these principals in mind, it will no longer be possible to have a funeral Mass with cremated remains present. Nor will the Rites of Christian Funerals be permitted if the cremated remains are to be dispersed, made into jewelry or placed on the mantle, bookshelf or china cabinet.

Funeral Rites will be offered *only* if the Body of the Deceased is present, after the Mass if the body is to be cremated the priest must have an assurance that the cremated remains will be interred or inurned in a Cemetery.

One does not have to buy a casket. Funeral homes offer casket rental. The Body is placed inside a Casket liner that will also serve as the cremation vessel. It fits into the rental casket and if you desire a viewing, that can be done and it will look like a regular casket because it is; only after the funeral the casket liner is removed with the body in it, are they cremated at the crematorium.

While dispersion of cremated remains is forbidden, burial at sea is allowed as long as there is no dispersion (tossing, throwing, scattering) of remains. Funeral homes offer a vessel that is bio-degradable and dignified that is tossed into the sea as the prayer of burial at sea is prayed. The remains gently float to the bottom of the ocean.

Human remains that are cremated must be kept intact and cannot be spooned out into other vessels as keep sakes for relatives and friends. They cannot be made into jewelry or other objects. The Body is sacred, has received the Sacraments and is a Temple of the Holy Spirit which must be buried in a Cemetery, a place where the dead await the Resurrection on the Great and Terrible Day of Christ's return in Glory. Catholics are buried facing East, the direction from which the Rising Son of God, Christ the Lord, will come at the end of time. He shall call us and we shall rise to face him who is our life and our Resurrection.


