Dear Parish Family,



The number one inquiry the last two weeks has been, "Why is there only one Mass on Ascension Thursday?" How soon we forget! In May of 2022, two years ago, the Bishops of New Jersey accepted the proposal of Cardinal Joseph Tobin (Metropolitan Archbishop of Newark) to transfer the Solemnity of the Ascension from Thursday to Sunday. More than 30 years ago, most of the dioceses in the United States transferred the Solemnity of the Ascension from Thursday to Sunday, however, a few Metropolitan Provinces, mostly in the Northeast, did not follow suit. With the appointment of Cardinal Tobin as Metropolitan of New Jersey, he proposed that the Bishops of the New Jersey Catholic Conference vote affirmatively to transfer the solemnity to the Sunday, which they did unanimously. So, for the last two years, we have followed the National Calendar. 1 am guessing that many of the callers have recently moved into New Jersey and are from a diocese that follows the older observance on a Thursday. So folks, today is the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord. Happy Ascension Sunday, the Solemnity formerly known as Thursday.

Last Sunday we had three lovely May Crownings held after the 5pm, 8:30am and 10:30am Masses. Why three? It was the last Mass-with-Class weekend for our Religious Education students and their families who gather after the 5pm, 8:30am and 10:30am Masses, and our First Communicants, who had received their First Holy Communion the previous weekend, were given the opportunity to crown the statue during each of the May Crownings. The Altar Rosary Society also participated making it a beautiful day for all despite the weather. Normally we have the crowning outside in the courtyard where the Our Lady of Fatima Statue is, but due to the weather, it was moved inside where it was both warm and dry!

Last Sunday was also Yom Hashoah, International Holocaust Remembrance Day. 1 represented the parish at a Yom Hashoah service in the evening; it was a very moving service. This year, a man and woman who survived the holocaust shed light on the horrors they endured. It was both a moving and painful testimony. One person in the Synagogue submitted a question asking the survivors how they viewed those who deny the holocaust. Both had the same answer, they said, "The Nazis lied, they were liars about everything. Those who deny the holocaust lie like the Nazis." As I listened to their testimony and the pain they felt at being hated, even to death, simply because of their religion, I thought the youth on our college campuses need to hear the first person witness of the concentration camps and of Hitler's "Final Solution". The ideas these college students are attempting to spread are based on lies someone has been filling their heads with. Listening to a first hand experience of what occurred in Germany is not an "idea", but a harsh reality. Reality trumps "ideas". Some "ideas" are dangerous and lead to death, the holocaust stands as proof.

Next weekend we will celebrate Pentecost Sunday, the birthday of the Church. The liturgical color for Pentecost is red, symbolizing the fire of the Holy Spirit which rested on the heads of the Mother of God and the Apostles in the Upper Room on Mount Zion in Jerusalem on the first Pentecost. I notice each year that some people will come to Mass wearing red. I invite everyone this year to celebrate and wear something red for Pentecost Sunday to make it an even more festive occasion!

This weekend we are having a bit of fun. There is a Wishing Well in the gathering space for those who would like to extend to our DRE/PCL Jen, and her husband Nick, "well wishes" on the impending birth of their Son!

Happy Mother's Day to all the wonderful mothers in our parish. We celebrate and bless you all today.



In the Catholic Church, the anointing of the sick is a sacrament that is administered to a Catholic "who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age". There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. The Sacrament may be received at any time during a person's illness, especially before surgery or treatment. We suggest calling to receive the Sacrament *before* a person is in grave danger of death as it is not always possible to have a priest available at the actual time of

death. If you would like to schedule the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for a loved one, please contact the parish office.




