Dear Parish Family-

Last week's bulletin contained a lengthy explanation on Catholic Funeral Practices especially in light of cremation, aquamation (water process) and modern commercial dispositions of mortal remains.

The Church prefers Burial of the Human Body in a Cemetery. Cremation is permitted however the Body must first come to Church for the Funeral Mass and then go for cremation.

Cremated remains must be disposed of in the same way as a Body by being interred (buried) in a Cemetery or Inurned (place in a niche) in a Cemetery.

Cremated remains may not be scattered by any means what-so-ever. Cremated remains may not be separated into separate jars or vessels and distributed like souvenirs.

Cremated remains may not be made into jewelry, statues, garden ornaments.

The Holy Father is concerned about newer methods of the disposition of the Human body which are contrary to Church teaching such as:

Aquamation where the human body is placed in a stainless steel vessel and reduced to water then shot out through a pipe into a detention field.

Human composting where the body is placed in a stainless steel drum with wood pulp and other organic matter and rotated until it is reduced to compost to be used for gardening.

These and other newer pagan practices are being promoted by the funeral industry and by organizations hostile to Christian values.

The Human Person is made in the image and likeness of God (Book of Genesis) and has an inherent dignity. Once Baptized, the person is configured to Christ and becomes a temple of the Holy Spirit. The human body has dignity. The Body should be treated with reverence and placed in a Cemetery where it awaits the Resurrection of the Body at the end of time when Christ the Lord appears in Glory at his second coming. The pagans called their burial places 'necropoli' literally cities of the dead. Christians called their burial places "cemeteries", places where the dead sleep awaiting Christ's summing them to life in the Resurrection of the Dead. Christians have always placed a high value on the cemetery and made visits to tend and care for their graves with reverence.

Beginning in May the new directives from the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith will come into force. We will no longer be able to accept funerals with cremated remains. The Body must come to Church for the Funeral and then go for cremation and we must be assured the cremated remains will be left intact and placed in a Cemetery.

While these directives are in conflict with modern man's flippant view of the human body, they are in accord with centuries of Christian witness and belief. The body has dignity whether dead or alive and is the image and likeness of God and therefore must be treated with reverence and respect.

In other words, we are all sent on a sacred mission to go and be a light to the world. We do this by keeping the Way of Jesus. By so doing, we glorify God.

Jesus says, "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest" (Matt. 9:37-38). As we seek to reinstate altar servers at all the Masses, please pray that the number of servers may grow, and that they be inspired to deepen their love of God by serving at his holy altar.

NEW JERSEY CATHOLIC CONFERENCE

Understanding Your Rights as a Parent Concerning New Jersey's Comprehensive Health and Physical Education Curriculum for Public School Students

The New Jersey Core Curriculum Content Standards for Comprehensive Health and Physical Education (CHPE) require all public school students to learn about a broad range of topics, including human relationships, mental health, social well-being, physical fitness, and sexual reproduction.

For many families, these topics are better addressed at home, at a time of the family's choosing, based on the development and readiness of the student. Fortunately, the CHPE curriculum contains an opt-out provision for students whose families do not want their child taking part in some or all of these lessons.

The New Jersey Catholic Conference has developed this guide to help Catholic families of public school students better understand their opt-out rights -- and how to effectively exercise them.

New Jersey statute currently states that:

- Any child whose parent or guardian presents to the school a signed statement that any part of instruction in health, family life education, or sex education is in conflict with his or her conscience or sincerely held moral or religious beliefs shall be excused from that portion of the course where such instruction is being given and no penalties as to credit or graduation shall result therefrom. Students excused from instruction must be provided with alternative instructional content and activities aligned with the New Jersey Student Learning Standards for CHPE and the local health education curriculum.



All parents/guardians should be notified of the excusal process by the school district. However, no specific procedures are specified, so the notification could be accomplished by letter, email, handbook reference, or website post.

If you are not notified or are unable to find instructions about the excusal process using your district's resources, it is essential that you reach out to your school to inquire because a lack of response from a parent intending to opt-out would provide the district with the assumption that you actually approve of the child attending the classes. (*You have opted-in unless you proactively opt-out.*)
