

Dear Parish Family-

Happy Ascension of the Lord! As I mentioned in last week's bulletin the Latin Rite Bishops of the Ecclesiastical Province of Newark (composed of the Archdiocese of Newark, Dioceses of Trenton, Camden, Paterson and Metuchen) met in March of 2022 and permanently transferred the Solemnity of the Ascension from Thursday to the Seventh Sunday of Easter. Today therefore we are celebrating the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord. Most of the Ecclesiastical Provinces across the nation transferred the Solemnity of the Ascension decades ago; there were only a few hold outs. Currently the Ecclesiastical Provinces of Boston, Hartford, New York, Omaha and Philadelphia still observe the Solemnity on a Thursday.

A pre-bid roofing meeting was held on Friday, May 12th for roofing companies interested in bidding on our last roofing project, the New Church. The bidding lasts 2-3 weeks and is then awarded to a contractor. Movement is underway and the roof should be replaced soon. The lighting project for Gonzaga Hall is underway, the fixtures arrived the first week of May and we are awaiting the contractor to install the new lighting. Once this is completed we will be able to safely use the Hall again. Gonzaga Hall has been closed due to instability of the current light fixtures, one of which came crashing down. The new lighting will be fixed to the support beams of the building and not the foam insulation.

First Communion was held on Sunday April 30th and 65 children will have received First Holy Communion this Easter Season. These children will also have a May Crowning ceremony as part of their religious education formation.

The Holy Father has issued new guidelines for preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage and the Diocese of Trenton is in the process of revamping our Sacramental Marriage preparations; these will be implemented in the near future. The Holy Father wishes for the process to image the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA, formerly called RCIA). The Office of Family Life is holding meetings to inform us of how the marriage preparations will be strengthened.







Our Rosary will be offered for peace in our world and for the safety, protection and victory of the Ukrainian people to end the evil war that has been inflicted upon them.




