Dear Parish Family,

Last Sunday, we celebrated the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord. In 2022, Cardinal Tobin, the Metropolitan Archbishop and head of the New Jersey Catholic Conference, encouraged the other Latin Rite Bishops of New Jersey to move the Solemnity of the Ascension from Thursday to Sunday, aligning with the national practice in the United States. The New Jersey Catholic Conference of Bishops then voted unanimously to transfer the Solemnity to the 7th Sunday of Easter. I addressed this change in 2022, when we first observed it on a Sunday, and we have discussed it in subsequent years. I assumed further explanation was unnecessary; however, the volume of phone calls, emails, and in-person questions suggests otherwise.



Given our proximity to New York, there may be an assumption that we follow the same liturgical calendar. However, while the Province of New York celebrates the Solemnity on Thursday, *we are not part of the New York Catholic Conference*. The Archdiocese of New Jersey has its own Catholic Conference and Bishops. We currently follow the national practice and celebrate the Ascension on the 7th Sunday of Easter. Therefore, if you missed Mass on Thursday, it was not a Holy Day of Obligation in New Jersey.

This leads us to this Sunday, Pentecost, often called the Church's birthday. When our Lord ascended to heaven, he commanded his followers to proclaim the Gospel and baptize all nations. Aware of their apprehension, he also promised to send the Holy Spirit to empower them for this mission. After the Ascension, the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples in the Upper Room on Mount Zion. This room is significant as the location where Jesus instituted the Eucharist at the Last Supper, established the Priesthood, gave the Mandatum, and where King David was buried. Mount Zion is also traditionally associated with the Assumption of Our Lady at the end of her earthly life. It is important to note that Mount Zion, the western hill outside the city walls of Jerusalem, is distinct from Mount Moriah, the eastern hill inside the walls where the Temple was built.

The Ascension, Last Supper, and Pentecost are all interconnected through the Upper Room. Medieval manuscripts often depict only the feet of Jesus emerging from the cloud, symbolizing the humility of God and directing us to the Mandatum of Holy Thursday: the Lord's command to serve one another. It is significant that Pentecost occurred in the same room, the Cenacle on Mount Zion, where Jesus instituted the Holy Eucharist and the Priesthood, and where he commanded us to serve each other. These events are united in faith. Without the fire of the Holy Spirit, the Apostles would have remained in Jerusalem, hindered by fear and lacking motivation. The Descent of the Holy Spirit provided them with courage and divine strength to proclaim the Gospel throughout the known world, even at the cost of their lives. All, except the Apostle John, suffered martyrdom. This testifies to the power of God's Spirit within them; once anointed by the Holy Spirit, nothing could deter them. This same Holy Spirit continues to inspire the Church and all believers today.

As we celebrate Pentecost, let us be open to the movement of the Spirit in our hearts.
