Dear Parish Family,

What's in a name? Cardinal Prevost chose Leo XIV for his papal name, a good, strong name! Some folks asked me last weekend why he chose Leo. Well, you know he is a Villanova Graduate (did I mention I am an alumnus? LOL), and the mascot for Villanova is the wildcat. He wanted to choose Pope Felis Ferus (wildcat in Latin), but it was too long and hard to pronounce, so he went with the simpler "Leone", the lion, a close enough relative. I am only kidding, of course! He chose Leo, he tells us, for many reasons which will become apparent as he begins his Pontificate; however, he did say specifically it was in homage to Pope Leo XIII, the first truly modern pope, and the Father of the Church's Social Doctrine.

Pope Leo XIII was truly one of the greatest popes of the Church, a favorite of mine, and I often wonder why he was never made a saint. His ideas were revolutionary in the best sense of the word. He was the third-longest-reigning pope until Pope St. John Paul II knocked him down to fourth place. He was chosen Pope at the age of 68, considered old at the time. The conclave that elected him hoped for a short reign after the long reign of Blessed Pius IX, his immediate predecessor. He was a small man by stature, but a giant in vision. He was considered to be a safe candidate as he was old and had been sickly most of his life. He lived to bury all those who elected him, dying at the age of 93! His most important work was an Encyclical entitled *Rerum Novarum*, meaning 'Of New Things', and ushered in a rich period of doctrinal social teaching on which every subsequent Pope has built, including Pope Francis and no doubt Pope Leo XIV will also build upon as well. The other important theme of Leo XIII was his works on Religious Freedom, which are very much in the foreground today as well. In some ways, Leo XIII was an American pope. He addressed and resolved an error of his day here in America called "Americanism", and reunited the divided American Bishops. He also gave to America two great missionary saints; Francis Xavier Cabrini, who told him she was going on mission to China, and he told her, "Not to the East but to the West you will go". She traveled to New York later, establishing missions in Chicago and New Orleans among other cities. The other great American Missionary was Philadelphia socialite Katherine Drexel, who when she met in private audience with Pope Leo XIII, challenged him to send missionaries to the Blacks and Indians. His response was to point his finger at her and say, "And you, what about you, why don't you be a missionary to them." Stunned at the response of the pope, she returned home. She founded her own group of nuns and put her entire vast fortune into the Black and Indian Missions so much so she died penniless!

Leo is, of course, a strong name, Leone meaning lion, which immediately calls to mind strength. When I lived in Rome, I went to St. Peter's to pray Mass on the Feast of Pope St. Leo the Great (the very first pope named Leo), and I was amazed at the crowds waiting for an altar, which was not normally the case. I was told there were long wait times for altars because Roman people still hold the first Pope Leo in high esteem. Luckily for the group of priests I was with, we ran into an American Franciscan who worked there, and tipped us off that the Altar of Our Lady of Guadalupe was free, and to use his name with the guards to gain access. We Americans look out for each other! Pope Saint Leo was the first pope to be acclaimed "the Great", and only one of two popes acclaimed "The Great", the other being Gregory. Pope Saint Leo the Great was a very capable administrator, diplomat, and deeply spiritual pope. He was the one who convinced Attila the Hun to abandon his attack on the City of Rome. He was a father and shepherd of his people, first and foremost, and remains beloved in our own day for his kindness and magnanimous spirit.

The first American Pope has chosen a very strong name, and one which gives us a clear indication where he intends to lead the Church, which he said is missionary, goes forth, cares for the poor, and the dignity of the human person. His name sake, Leo XIII, met the challenges of the Industrial Revolution; hence Pope Leo XIV intends to confront the challenges of the new industrial revolution of artificial intelligence that threatens humanity.

Let us pray for our new pope and fellow countryman! God has truly blessed his Church with a great Vicar of Christ.



In the Catholic Church, the anointing of the sick is a sacrament that is administered to a Catholic "who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age". There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. The Sacrament may be received at any time during a person's illness, especially before surgery or treatment. We suggest calling to receive the Sacrament *before* a person is in grave danger of death as it is not always possible to have a priest available at the actual time of death. If you would like to schedule the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for a loved one, please contact the parish office.


