Dear Parish Family-

You know its Spring when the daffodils, tulips, iris, redbud, dogwood and lilac bloom, birds sing, puppies are born and.....the Gypsies show up in the parking lot! To paraphrase a much seen sign, "Please do not feed the Gypsies". They run when they see me coming and suddenly their limp disappears, another miracle for my Canonization! This is private property and they are not authorized to collect funds. Our St. Vincent de Paul Society has reached out to see if they have a real need, nope they just want cash. Please do not encourage them otherwise they will keep coming. If you want to help the needy, please donate your hard earned cash to the St. Vincent de Paul Society where every dollar counts to assist families with real needs and, unfortunately, there is no shortage of those who have legitimate need.

As was announced in a previous bulletin, the roof pre-bid meeting was held on Friday, May 12th and lasted about 2 hours. Two representatives from Carlisle Commercial Roofing Solutions were present for the meeting and available for questions from the roofing contractors interested in bidding. Carlisle is the company that manufactures the product called for by the consultant, J. D. Cummings, for this particular roof project. The Diocese of Trenton also sent Scott Perozzi, Director of Construction and Real Estate as an observer. The prospective roofing contractors toured the interior and exterior of the building and climbed onto the Church roof. Bids are due by the end of business Friday, May 26th. This coming week we will meet with the consultant and award a contract to a winning bid. This project is quite complex with a lot of moving parts but everything is specified in the pre-bid documents. The consultant estimates work to commence sometime in July and last through November. Carlisle stated the materials called for are in stock and delivery would be made 6 weeks after the order is placed by the winning bidder.

During roof construction, the Church will be closed due to safety and noise concerns. Gonzaga Hall will serve as the Parish Church once again for a short time with daily Masses, funerals and other Liturgical Rites taking place there just as they did when the pipe burst under the floor in the Church which had to be jack hammered and dug up to be repaired. I apologize in advance for the inconvenience.

Gonzaga Hall, as you know from previous bulletins had an issue with the lights and the way they were held in place; one fell during re-roofing. The decision was made to replace all the lighting in Gonzaga Hall. This work will be finished in time for us to occupy that space during re-roofing of the New Church. The lighting in Gonzaga Hall was chosen to comply with our Holy Father's call for parishes to embrace more environmentally sound systems. The new lighting is all LED and energy efficient. It is also much brighter than the old lighting making the ability to see much improved!

This Sunday is Pentecost Sunday, the birthday of the Church. Happy Birthday to everyone! The gift of the Holy Spirit continues to move the Church and her members. The modern popes have all reminded us the Holy Spirit is one of surprises, wonderful surprises, and we must be open to the surprise of the Holy Spirit. May we all open ourselves to the Movement of the Holy Spirit who continues to guide the Synod on Synodality moving the Church to new visions and challenges us to dream together as a Church. Let us all continue to pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit as the preparations for the Opening of the Synod in Rome this Fall are underway. Each of us was given an opportunity to contribute to the Synod and all of us are called to pray to the Holy Spirit for its success.

Prayer to the Holy Spirit: Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created and you will renew the face of the earth.

Lord, by the light of the Holy Spirit you have taught the hearts of your faithful. In the same Spirit help us to relish what is right and always rejoice in your consolation. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Let us support them with our prayers and welcoming presence so that they may live fulfilling lives as disciples of Jesus Christ. 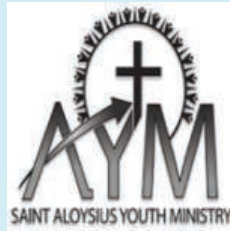
CHRISTIAN BOOK STUDY
