Dear Parish Family,

On Monday, May 12, there was a bit of excitement here. At 7:30 am, Law Enforcement received a bomb threat against the Alpha School. The Jackson Police Department responded immediately and evacuated the entire facility; thus, daily Mass was cancelled, but I offered Mass after the event for the stated intention. Multiple Law Enforcement agencies responded, including Lakewood PD, Ocean County Sheriff's Office, Monmouth County Sheriff's Office, and Transit Police, along with several K-9 Units. Being a dog lover, I got excited when a Bloodhound joined the Labradors and German Shepherds! Bloodhounds have tremendous scent powers and look cool with their huge ears! The event was professionally handled, and the "all clear" was given by 9:30 am. Traffic around the compound was quite heavy. By 10 am, everything was very quiet as all activities for the school were cancelled!

Today is Ascension "*Thursday*," on Sunday, making it Ascension Sunday! The Bishops of the United States asked for permission to transfer the Solemnity of the Ascension to Sunday decades ago, and all but a handful of Dioceses did transfer it to Sunday. The Province of Newark (which we are a part of) did not; the New Jersey Bishops kept it on Thursday until we received a new Metropolitan Archbishop in the person of Cardinal Tobin, who convinced the New Jersey Bishops to transfer the Solemnity to Sunday, which they did several years ago.

The Solemnity of the Ascension marks the end of the 40-day period following Easter. Next Sunday is the Solemnity of Pentecost, followed by the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, followed by the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus. This year, the Solemnity of the Blessed Apostles, Peter and Paul, falls on Sunday, June 29.

The Sundays of June are filled with solemnities; how wonderful is that! May is traditionally dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary, and there are May Crownings at some point during the month. Our parish had two May Crownings the weekend of May 17 and 18; one after the Saturday 5pm Mass and one after the 10:30am Mass. June is traditionally observed as the month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. You may have noticed flying at the priest's house, the Sacred Heart Flag, which reads, "Sacred Heart of Jesus, I trust in You". As we begin the month of June, it would be nice if all Catholics reclaimed the month of June for the Sacred Heart of Jesus, a heart that beats for each one of us, a heart that reaches out to each one of us, a heart that loves beyond measure every one of us!

Finally, next weekend is Pentecost, the day we mark as the day of birth of the Church, when the Apostles and the Virgin Mary gathered together in the Cenacle on Mount Zion, the same place as the Last Supper, and first encountered the Risen Lord. There, they received the gift of the Holy Spirit in the form of tongues of fire (Acts 2:3) burning over their heads, and were filled with the Holy Spirit. The same Holy Spirit that breathed life into the Church continues to move among us and guide us still. I invite you to wear something red that day to Church, if you remember; a small gesture to recall the fire of the Holy Spirit and enliven the worship space.

In the Catholic Church, the anointing of the sick is a sacrament that is administered to a Catholic "who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age". There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. The Sacrament may be received at any time during a person's illness, especially before surgery or treatment. We suggest calling to receive the Sacrament *before* a person is in grave danger of death as it is not always possible to have a priest available at the actual time of death. If you would like to schedule the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for a loved one, please contact the parish office.

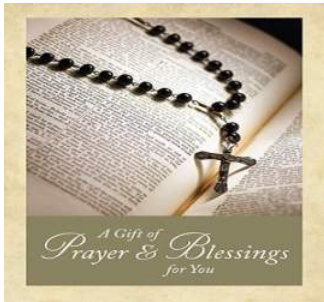

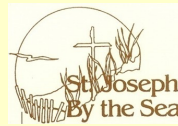
The Annual Enrollment is a beautiful gift for special times in life and for the eternal rest of our faithful departed. We are very happy to pray for you and your loved ones.
