Dear Parish Family-

Roof contractor bids were opened on Wednesday, May 31 for the New Church Roof project, due to bulletin deadlines I cannot say at this time which company was awarded the contract. Some bids had arrived earlier than the deadline and suffice it to say they were all well over one million dollars.

During re-roofing, anticipated to start sometime in July, all daily Masses and funerals from July to November will be held in Gonzaga Hall. It is quite possible the New Church may have to be closed entirely including on weekends depending on circumstances. We know this roof has leaked since before the building was occupied in 2009 and there may be damage to the sub-structures that are unforeseen and also costly. I am giving fair warning this is an unavoidable possibility. Until the existing standing seam metal roof is removed we will not be able to access the roof structure's integrity.

The new roofing material will be a type of synthetic rubber, the same color grey as the existing roof and will have 'architectural ribs' to imitate the standing metal seam of the existing roof; they will be glued onto the surface of the roof material. The roof should look similar to what you now see, thus not impeding the architect's intent for the look of the building.

The re-lighting project for Gonzaga Hall was completed and all new LED lights have been securely fastened to the structural beams and are in place and operable.

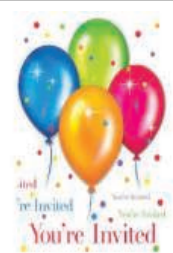

Sunday, June 11th, is the Feast of Corpus Christi, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, celebrating the real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. Very early in the fourteenth century, the custom developed of carrying the Blessed Sacrament in a splendid procession through the town after the Mass on Corpus Christi Day. The Council of Trent (1545-1563) solemnly approved and recommended the procession on Corpus Christi as a public profession of the Catholic faith in the real presence of Christ in the Holy Sacrament.

All are invited to join in the **Eucharistic Procession around the Church parking lot immediately following the 12PM Solemn Mass on Sunday, June 11th**. The *First Communicant* girls will lead the procession laying flowers before our Lord, Jesus Christ. The procession will conclude with Adoration and Benediction in the Church.

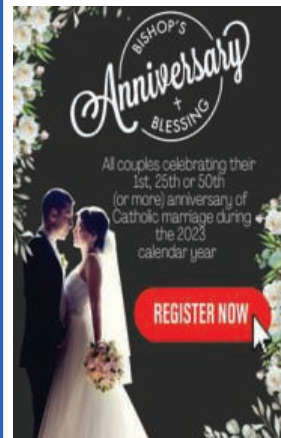

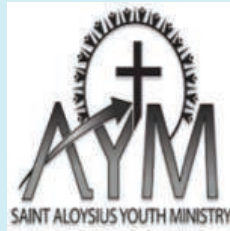
