Dear Parish Family,

This Sunday, we celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost. At the Ascension, the Lord promised, “You will receive the power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem... and to the ends of the earth” (Acts 1:8). Acts of the Apostles then tells us that “When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all gathered in one place together. And suddenly, there came from the sky, a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim.” The strong wind is the ‘Ruah’ or life-giving breath of God. Fire is the Theophany of God. God is felt through His life-giving breath and seen in the fire of the Pentecost event.

Notice the passage from Acts speaks of the “time of Pentecost was fulfilled”; the reference is to the Jewish Feast of Pentecost found in Leviticus 23:15-16. It is also called the Feast of Weeks or Shavuot, which in Greek is ‘Pentecost’ (meaning fiftieth). It was originally an agricultural feast offering the first fruits of the grain of the land as a sacrifice to God. It was one of three pilgrimage feasts, along with Passover and Tabernacles. Shavuot or Pentecost also commemorated the revelation of the Torah or Pentateuch (first five books of the Bible) to Moses on Mount Sinai. The Christian observance of Shavuot/Pentecost commemorates the giving of the Holy Spirit as Tongues of Fire. Fire is associated with God’s presence in the Mount Sinai Theophany.

Proclamation of the Gospel, the Good News of Jesus, is enabled by the Holy Spirit. Thus it was then, and is so today as well. The Spirit remains with the Church. In May, we were witnesses of the movement of the Holy Spirit in the selection of the Bishop of Rome, our Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV. The Holy Spirit is free and given freely, but we must accept it, receive it, and allow it to move in us. This is the very story of the recent conclave: the Holy Spirit did not choose the Pope, but moved among the Cardinals and directed their gaze to the right man for our time, they responded. This is the work of God, who does not impose Himself or His Will upon us but moves in our hearts in the hope we accept and follow His Spirit and direction, accepting His Will as our will.

Pentecost marks the birth of the Church, whose birthing is brought about by the giving of the Holy Spirit, the Breath of God, which gives life to all things. You have no doubt heard many times here in our country, “The Catholic Church is not a democracy” or “The Catholic Church needs to be a more democratic institution”. Maybe some might hope an American Pope will impose Democracy on the Church even! The Church can never be Democratic in nature; it is impossible because she is divinely created from above, and not from below. The Church receives life from above, and was created by the very breath of God, not by the will of the people. Her belief system comes from the Second Person of the Most Holy Trinity, Our Lord Jesus Christ. The teachings of the Church did not emerge from the consensus of the people as a distillate of their common religious experience. The term Jesus uses in the Gospel of John for the Holy Spirit is “Advocate” from the Greek word “Parakletos,” literally meaning, “calling to one’s side”, meaning a helper or someone who speaks for another in the manner of a lawyer.

God speaks to us through his Prophets, the Bishops, in union with the Pope. Jesus leaves the interpretation of his teaching to Peter and his successors through the advocacy of the Holy Spirit. Thus, we can be assured it is worthy of right belief.

As Bishop Barron explains, “When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all truth (John 16:12-13). We see in these fascinating passages, first, that the Holy Spirit works in tight connection with Jesus, and second, that the truth implicit in Jesus requires the ministrations of the Spirit to come to fully developed expression...the Spirit...is the Interpreter of the Word, monitoring its development through the course of the Church’s life.” Thus, the Church is always and forever guided by the Holy Spirit, the Spirit of God that moves in and through her.

In the Catholic Church, the anointing of the sick is a sacrament that is administered to a Catholic "who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age". There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. The Sacrament may be received at any time during a person's illness, especially before surgery or treatment. We suggest calling to receive the Sacrament *before* a person is in grave danger of death as it is not always possible to have a priest available at the actual time of death. If you would like to schedule the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for a loved one, please contact the parish office.

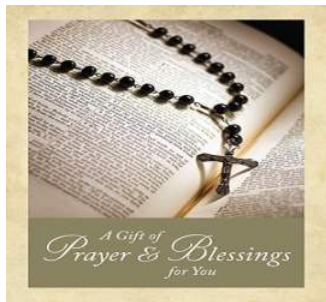

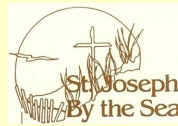
The Annual Enrollment is a beautiful gift for special times in life and for the eternal rest of our faithful departed. We are very happy to pray for you and your loved ones.
