Dear Parish Family,

It has been a while since I have mentioned the Synod on Synodality. The final phase will begin this fall, followed by a document written by Pope Francis. The Holy Father desires a more "Synodal Church", by this he means a Church that listens. By 'Church' he means the "People of God", and who are the People of God? The People of God are all the Baptized; laity, deacons, priests, bishops, those in consecrated life...in other words, everyone, or as the Holy Father likes to say, "Todos, Todos, Todos".

Over the last year, the National Bishops Conferences held national listening sessions or round table discussions. These were added last October after the parish and diocesan listening sessions, and will all go to Rome for the final phase this fall. The National Conference of Catholic Bishops of the United States a few weeks ago, published a synthesis from our country's national listening sessions, the title is a mouthful, "National Synthesis of the People of God in the United States of America for the Interim Stage of the 2021-2024 Synod" You can read the entire document on the USCCB Website.

The Synthesis is long, and a bit dry, but it contains some very useful tidbits. The participants across the country called our Church both a "safe harbor" and "a fiery communion". I thought those were great ways to describe our National Church. Participants saw the local parish Church as a safe space to go in times of need, a safe harbor from the storms of life. This was a pretty straightforward description. "Fiery communion" bore out a dual meaning. They saw the Church as very much alive, warm and ablaze, but also a Church in tension, and at times, polarized.

They describe the tension as both good, and bad, helpful, and destructive. Good and helpful when people listen to each other, even when they strongly disagreed, with respect for each other's opinions; bad and destructive when it leads to polarization, an "us vs. them" attitude.

The Synthesis also called for a formation in evangelization. They found that parishes who have Bible Study, prayer groups, and foster a deep sense of community, were the best safe harbors and fiery communions. We offer all of those so that was nice to hear. In fact, in late September/early October we will be adding a women's only Bible Study aimed at women 20-60 called "Walking With Purpose", look for it in the bulletin.

Finally, they said, "where grace and gratitude abound, God's presence is evident". Amen to that!

Tickets will be available for sale after all Masses and at the parish office. With only 120 tickets available you won't want to miss out on this joyous occasion



In the Catholic Church, the anointing of the sick is a sacrament that is administered to a Catholic "who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age". There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. The Sacrament may be received at any time during a person's illness, especially before surgery or treatment. We suggest calling to receive the Sacrament *before* a person is in grave danger of death as it is not always possible to have a priest available at the actual time of

death. If you would like to schedule the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for a loved one, please contact the parish office.


