Dear Parish Family-

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, formerly called Corpus Christi Sunday. This great Solemnity reminds us of the greatest gift Jesus gave us before the Crucifixion, his very body and blood, soul and divinity, true, real and substantial. *"In the Eucharist, therefore, there is present in a Sacramental way, that is, under the species of bread and wine, Christ whole and entire, God and Man. He left us his very self so that we would never be separated from Him."* (CCC)

In the Ascension of the Lord he takes our humanity to the right hand of Divinity to be placed next to the Father, at Pentecost He sends down the Holy Spirit upon the Church to birth and energize it for the work of Evangelization.

In giving us His Body and Blood he feeds us and sustains us on our Pilgrim Way.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us, *"The Eucharist is the very sacrifice of the Body and Blood of the Lord Jesus which he instituted to perpetuate the sacrifice of the cross throughout the ages until his return. Thus he entrusted to the Church this memorial of his death and Resurrection. It is a sign of unity, a bond of charity, a paschal banquet, in which Christ is consumed, the mind filled with grace, and a pledge of future glory is given to us."*

It further teaches us, *"In the Eucharist the sacrifice of Christ becomes also the sacrifice of the members of his body. The lives of the faithful, their praise, their suffering, their prayers, their work, are united to those of Christ. In as much as it is a sacrifice, the Eucharist is likewise offered for all the faithful, living and dead, in reparation for sins of all and to obtain spiritual and temporal benefits from God. The Church of heaven is also united to the offering of Christ."*

The Church holds this mystery as a great treasure. *"The Church obligates the faithful to participate at Holy Mass every Sunday and on Holy Days of Obligation. She recommends participation at Holy Mass on other days as well."* (CCC)

Since the time of St. Pius X, the Church has strongly encouraged Catholics to receive Holy Communion at Mass if properly disposed. The Catechism tells us, *"To receive Holy Communion one must be fully incorporated into the Catholic Church and be in a State of Grace; that is not conscious of being in mortal sin. Anyone who is conscious of having committed a grave sin must first receive the sacrament of Reconciliation before going to Communion. Also important for those receiving Holy Communion are a spirit of recollection and prayer, observance of the fast proscribed by the Church and an appropriate disposition of the body (gesture and dress) as a sign of respect for Christ."* The current norm of fasting before Holy Communion is one hour before reception of Holy Communion.

**Today Sunday, June 11th** is the Feast of Corpus Christi, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, celebrating the real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. Very early in the fourteenth century, the custom developed of carrying the Blessed Sacrament in a splendid procession through the town after the Mass on Corpus Christi Day. The Council of Trent (1545-1563) solemnly approved and recommended the procession on Corpus Christi as a public profession of the Catholic faith in the real presence of Christ in the Holy Sacrament.

All are invited to join in the **Eucharistic Procession around the Church parking lot immediately following the 12PM Solemn Mass on Sunday, June 11th**. The *First Communicant* girls will lead the procession laying flowers before our Lord, Jesus Christ. The procession will conclude with Adoration and Benediction in the Church.

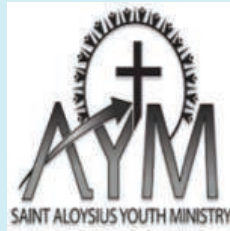
