

Traditional Mass Catechesis by Fr. Jim  
The Altar, Part 2

A few weeks back I had highlighted the altar and the sanctuary. This week, I want to focus more intently on the main altar. Once again, the word **altar** comes from the Latin *altus*, which means “high thing.” Perhaps you have been in another church with a **high altar**? Such altars are often built against the apse of the church, ornately decorated, with a built-in tabernacle, carvings, statues, candles, and four pillars holding up the *mensa* or table top where the sacrifice takes place (not all that different from our new altar of repose).

Typically high altars are made of solid stone and require reinforcement from the basement. In other words, their very structure extends deep into the bedrock below. This symbolism is often lost on we who enjoy their beauty from above, but the two important Scriptures bar mentioning with respect to the **altar**: “For no one can lay a foundation other than the one that is there, namely, Jesus Christ” (1 Cor. 3:11) and, “He is ‘the stone rejected by you, the builders, which has become the cornerstone.’ There is no salvation through anyone else, nor is there any other name under heaven given to the human race by which we are to be saved” (Acts 4:11-12). The **altar**, therefore, is Jesus, who is the rock, the foundation, the cornerstone upon which our faith has been built.

During the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, our focus is on the sacrifice of Christ on Calvary, therefore our attention is directed toward the altar, where the sacrifice is re-presented by the priest. This is why the altar is the central focus within the church. Everything flows to it, everything flows from it. Our thoughts, our prayers, our hopes, our dreams, our love, all find a place on the altar of Christ.

Come join us on Sundays at 12PM for a more traditional version of the **Novus Ordo** Mass.


